Apopka Memorial's new SRO builds bridges with students

The Apopka Police Department appointed a new school resource officer (SRO) for Apopka Memorial Middle School, which has a student enrollment of approximately 1,000.

Officer Barry Brown, 36, had been with the Apopka Police Department for a little over two years when he was recently tapped to become the middle school's SRO.

His main priority is to protect students and staff, as well as to build positive relationships with the children.

"I love it. It's been a real joy, a pleasure," Brown said. "The staff has been great. The students have been great. I have gotten to know a lot of students. They're actually excited to see me most of the time. It's been a true pleasure for me to be here in this position."

Brown's efforts to build bridges with the middle school students include telling them riddles, giving them coupons, and sitting with them at lunchtime.

"That's a goal of mine, and it appears, so far, that I'm succeeding in that manner," he said. "Even some of the kids that were a bit standoffish in the first

few days (of school), now they're coming up to me and giving me high-fives."

To become an SRO, Brown submitted an application of interest, did a memorandum at the Apopka Police Department per the policy, then stood in front of the Apopka Police Department's oral board, who presented Brown with questions related to the SRO position, which he answered.

The oral board is comprised of three members of the Apopka Police Department: the school resource sergeant and two school resource officers.

"I was fortunate

enough to be chosen for this position," Brown said.

Dr. Kelly Pelletier, Apopka Memorial Middle School principal, commended the dynamic between the students and Brown.

"It has been great. He has been wonderful," Pelletier said. "He has been forming relationships and getting to know our students. He's learning their names, he goes into the lunch shifts and talks with them; he sits at a table and talks with them. He wants them to become comfortable with him so in case

Zellwood Historical Society will host historical reunion

The Zellwood Historical Society and Museum is again hosting its annual reunion on Saturday, September 10, from noon to 4 p.m. at the Zellwood Community Center, 3160 Union St., Zellwood. The theme of this year's event is "Celebrating Zellwood" due to the community's pride of its heritage.

Opening ceremonies will begin at noon with the Apopka High School ROTC's Color Guard presenting the colors.

During the day there will be cake-walks, door prizes and a 50/50 raffle. Laurie Marsell, as well as the band Faith Cross, both of Zellwood, will perform music.

Tea sandwiches, cookies and punch will be served.

The CARE Foundation will bring some of their animals from 2 to 4 p.m.

Local first responders will be on hand to answer questions and to display the fire engine for kids to see.

Zellwood families' roots run deep

This year's theme is "Celebrating Zellwood" because Zellwood is a community that is proud of its rich heritage. Families with roots that run back generations in the community will have photographic displays of their kin, such as the Grinnells, whose father Charles Grinnell Sr. was one

of the farmers who grew crops on the muck farms. Another family is the Shivers; W.B. and Louise Shiver ran a vegetable and fruit stand on U.S. Highway 441 in Zellwood for many years.

The family of Basil Miller, who moved to Florida to work in the citrus industry from Georgia, will display photographs of old items. There were 11 siblings and all but one moved to Florida in and around Zellwood back in the late 1940s. Some, like Deloris Lynch's father, worked for Duda and Sons who were also farmers on the muck land. Like Deloris Lynch, a lot of the cousins still reside in Zellwood. There was an influx of people who migrated from Georgia at the same time.

Zellwood churches will also be displaying historical facts about their churches over the years.

The community, which is 140 years old this year, was named Zellwood after Colonel Thomas Elwood Zell. The name became official in 1876. Guests at the reunion will get the chance to hear about the person who named the community after Zell. The historical society found a record of it in Zell's handwritten book, which is in the museum.

Areas of summer instruction included first aid, mountaineering, hand grenades, rifle marksmanship and nuclear, biological, and chemical training.

Hancock began classes August 15. The West Point curriculum offers 37 majors balancing physical sciences and engineering with humanities and social sciences leading to a bachelor of science de-

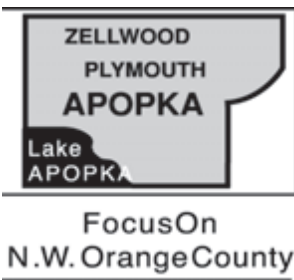
gree. Hancock graduated from Edgewater High School. He plans to graduate from West Point in 2020 and be commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army.

Scrutinizing our own motives and judging ourselves can often be valuable for our own spiritual progress, but judging others is almost always a mistake because we simply can't know someone else's motives. So why do we do it? Why are we so quick to judge other people? Perhaps part of the reason is simply that to get along with others it helps to be in tune with what others are

thinking and feeling. We can't be blind to the fact that other people have feelings and motives for doing what they do. But by judging others charitably, and assuming the best of them rather than the worst, we usually get along much better. In fact, sometimes the charitable judgement becomes a self-fulfilling prophecy. So if you are going to be hasty in making judgements about others, at least be hasty in making charitable judgements. All it takes is a bit of kindness, empathy, and perhaps a smile to get others to act with kindness, empathy and a smile of their own.

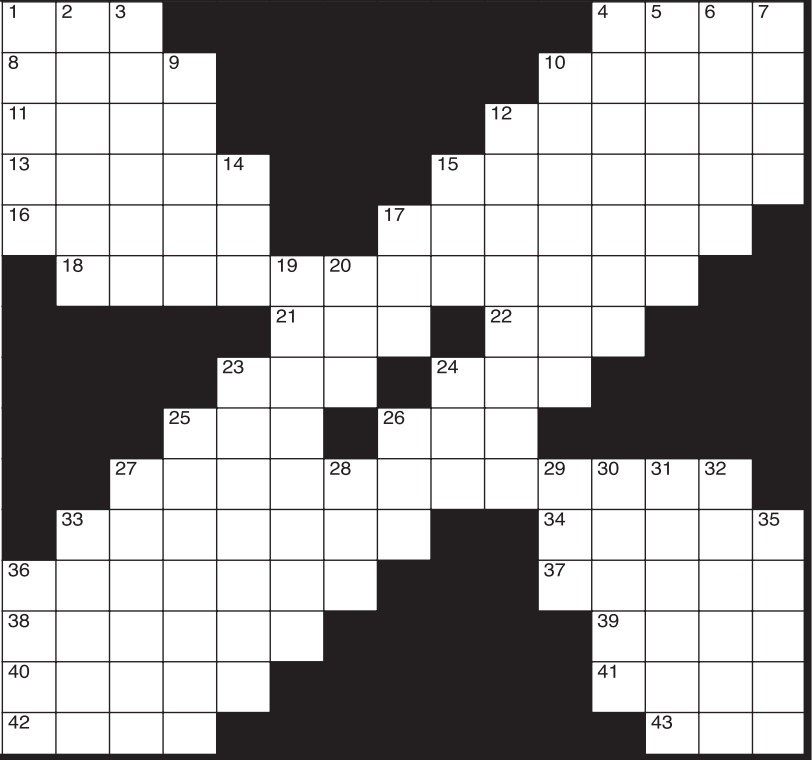

mando, the faculty and staff have been showing her the ropes, called the students “great” and the parents have been supportive.

Pender taught first and fifth grades, and sixth grade math. She has been a math coach, STEM coach, instruction coach, as well as being the faculty advisor for extracurricular clubs.

“(It’s about) getting children involved in extracurricular activities so they can see how what they do during the school day can connect to what’s outside the school,” she said.

Pender received her bachelor’s in 2002 and her master’s in 2004, both from Florida A&M University.

She got her education leadership degree in 2008 from National Louis Uni-

versity.

There were 138 assistant principal pool candidates who were interviewed during the last district-wide interview process.

they have any issues they want to bring to his attention, they can.”

As of now, Brown hasn’t set up any student education programs, but he is researching them and reaching out to contacts as steps toward implementing some programs.

Last May at the 19th annual Law Enforcement Appreciation (LEO) lun-

cheon, the Greater Orlando Chapter of ASIS International recognized Brown as one of the recipients of the LEO Award. Brown received this honor for saving the life of a fellow officer.

On December 15, 2015, while working an off-duty assignment at the Sam’s Club in Apopka, Brown performed the Heimlich maneuver on the officer, who was choking on food and who ap-

proached him for help.

Prior to the Apopka Police Department, Brown was with the Titusville Police Department; he was the criminal investigations detective when he left them. He resides in Seminole County.

Brown is a full-time permanent replacement for Jose Diaz, who previously served as the middle school’s SRO for one year. Diaz was reassigned to a

high school SRO position to replace Officer Jamie Anderson who retired.

“SROs usually stay in their assignments for a number of years, and often they watch the students grow up,” said Captain Randy Fernandez in an email.

However, any position is subject to reassignment at the police chief’s discretion, according to Fernandez.

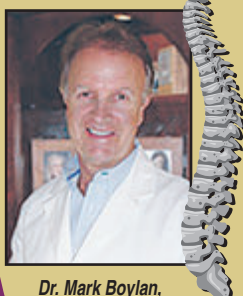

PALMETTO CREEK FARMS, AVON PARK, DRY-RUBBED BABY BACK RIBS Recipe from *Field to Feast* 1/4 cup packed dark brown sugar

1/4 cup paprika
1/4 cup ancho chili powder (dark Mexican chili powder)
4 teaspoons coarse salt
4 teaspoons smoked paprika
4 teaspoons cumin
4 teaspoons cayenne
4 (2-pound) slabs loin back ribs, membrane removed (ask your butcher to do this for you)
For the rub:

Mix brown sugar, paprika, ancho chili powder, salt, smoked paprika, cumin, and cayenne in a small bowl, making sure to break up chunks of brown sugar.

Put ribs bone side up on sheet pan. Season each slab with rub on both sides. Refrigerate at least 1 hour, loosely covered.

Heat oven to 250 degrees Fahrenheit. Cut four (12- by 12-inch) square sheets of heavy-duty aluminum foil. Put a slab of ribs, meat side up, on a sheet of foil. Fold ends to make loose packet around each slab; seal. Put packets on sheet pan. Bake 2- to 2-1/2 hours. Check ribs for doneness by gently pulling on bones. When they begin to pull away from meat, they are ready to serve.

DIANE BUNNELL'S BROCCOLI CASSEROLE Recipe from Northside Baptist Church

1 small package frozen, chopped broccoli
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 soup can of minute rice
1/2 stick melted butter
1 8-ounce jar of Cheese-Whiz
1 onion, chopped (optional)

Cook broccoli in microwave according to package directions, drain. Add all of the other ingredients and mix together. Put in buttered casserole dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until center is hot.

Melt half of the butter in a small saucepan over low heat. Add garlic cloves. Cover and cook until golden and tender (about 20 minutes), stirring occasionally. 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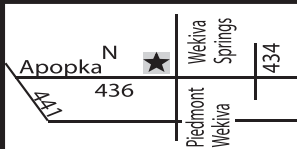
