Planning Commission gives OK to changes

The Apopka Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval on a

request for a future land use amendment and a change of zoning on an estimated 4.42-acre property, located at 904 Schopke-Lester Road, from "county" A-1

(ZIP) to "city" AG-E (agriculture estate). The property owners want to use the land to accommodate an existing single-family residential home and an aquaponics garden for hobby use.

Property owners Huy Tran and Hai Anh Nguyen put in their requests for change of zoning on their Schopke-Lester property, which was annexed into the city on December 2, 2015. Tran and Nguyen want the city to assign a future land use designation of residential low, which goes from zero to five dwelling units per acre, to the property. The owners also want the zoning classification of AG-E assigned to the property.

When addressing the Planning Commission, Tran said he wants to use the tract as a "demonstration facility" to prove some aquaponics theories that have been in practice for many years as well as to test new theories. Tran lives at 904 Schopke-Lester Road and consults clients around the world, including NASA, on aquaponics, he said.

Aquaponics is a form of hydroponics in which waste is taken from fish or some other marine creatures to fertilize plants grown under hydroponics, which uses nutrient materials in water without soil. The plant then purifies the water.

Tran said he would be

open to give tours of his demonstration facility. He also is collaborating with Wekiva High School on establishing its aquaponics lab, for which the school is applying for grant money and is hoping to launch the program if the grant is won.

"Apopka has a lot of opportunity to get into agriculture again," Tran said. "This is a good way of doing it."

The City Council's first reading of the future land use amendment and change of zoning is scheduled for Wednesday, January 20, at 7 p.m. at City Hall. The second reading is slated for Wednesday, February 3 at 1:30 p.m., also at City Hall.

Birdapalooza set for February 6 on Lake Apopka North Shore

The fourth annual Lake Apopka Wildlife Festival and Birdapalooza will be held Saturday, February 6, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. at Orange County's Magnolia Park at 2929 S. Binion Rd., Apopka.

Birdapalooza is a free event that will showcase the 20,000-acre Lake Apopka North Shore and its unique habitat for hundreds of bird species and other wildlife.

"This will be a day of fun and learning for the whole family," a spokes-

man said. There will be guided nature photography hikes (one leaving at 7:30 a.m.), guided bus tours (limited first-come seating), guided walking and biking nature tours for children and adults on the Lake Apopka Loop Trail, entertainment by IBEX Puppetry, bounce houses, face painting, live animal demonstrations, tree giveaways, music, airboat rides (for a fee), exhibitors, merchandise vendors and food trucks.

This year, in addition to the free Saturday festival, Birdapalooza has added a Friday Birding Festival with guided field trips throughout the Lake Apopka North Shore by well-known birding trip leaders, for a donation toward Orange Audubon Society's Nature Education Center Fund.



Property appraiser has satellite offices

Orange County property owners who have not already done so may file for homestead exemption at any of the satellite offices of the Orange County Property Appraiser's Office is bringing to locals all over the county, including the Apopka area, in January and February.

The Florida homestead exemption deadline is March 1.

A homestead exemption is a legal protection of a home's value from creditors, property taxes and sit-

uations that may come from the death of a homeowner's spouse.

There are three Apopka locations hosting satellite offices: Bravo supermarket at the Apopka Plaza, Fran Carlton Recreation Center, and the North Orange Branch Library.

The first Apopka satellite office will be at Bravo supermarket on Tuesday, January 19, from 1-7 p.m. The address is 519 S. Orange Blossom Trail.

The second one will be at the Fran Carlton Recre-

ation Center on Thursday, January 21, and Friday, January 22, from 1-7 p.m. on both days. The address is 11 N. Forest Ave.

The third Apopka satellite office location is at the North Orange Branch Library, which will be held on Friday, February 19, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. The address is 1211 E. Semoran Blvd.
