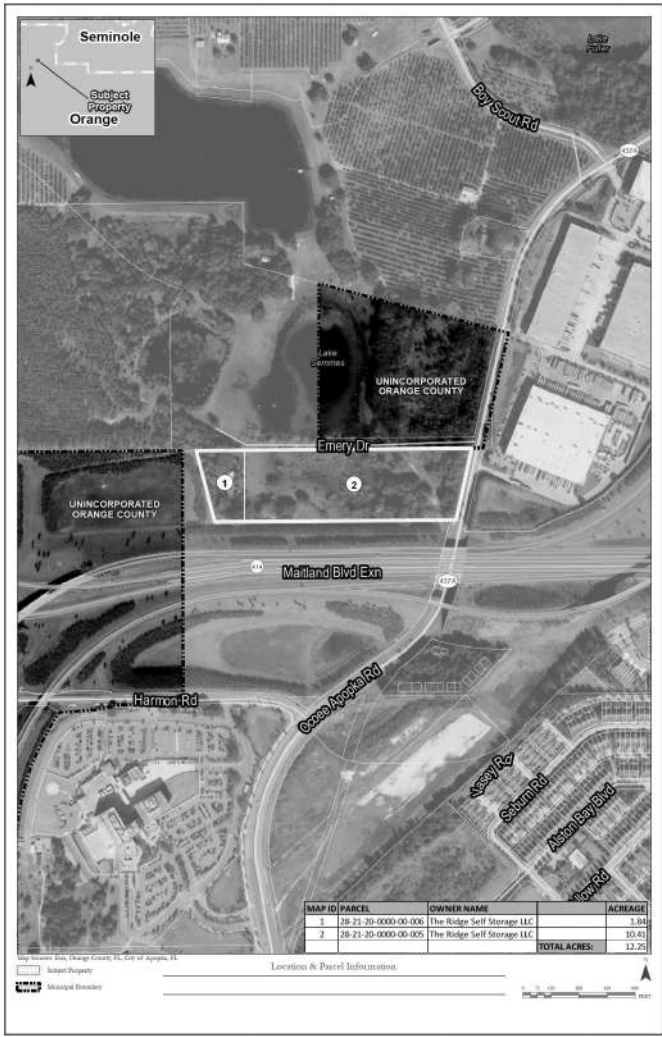

controls over curriculum, and prohibits students and teachers from being required to use language that violates their personal convictions.

Another was HB 1521, filed by Rep. Rachel Plakon, R-Lake Mary, which requires restrooms and changing facilities only be used by individual's according to their biological

sex. It also applies to domestic violence centers and correctional institutions and entities that receive state licenses.

Opponents argue the laws, which went into effect July 1, are discriminatory against people who identify as different genders or use different pronouns. They argue the laws will harm the LGBTQ+ community.

at this time.

7. P&R - Given the proximity to RSR Homeowners, the parking lot lights proposed along Brush Drive must be on a timer to close within an hour of the park closing.

8. P&R - Camp Wewa, like Economic Development, in order to grow business and deliver the BREAK EVEN the taxpayers were promised, you need a Camp Wewa Director specifically focused on utilization and growth. With the right leader, this has the potential of becoming a profit center to further grow our Parks and Recreation.

Looking at tonight's presentations, we do not want another tragic event to be the trigger for us to staff according to our needs and growth. Having adequate staffing for Staff safety and

response times are critical and MUST BE OF CONSIDERATION given our 35-plus square miles. We cannot just look at number of 1st responders per capita compared to other communities.

**Second day observations & recommendations for your consideration:**

The Police Department should be staffed at a minimum of 144 when you look at the increase in crime statistics, increase in response times and consideration of the square miles our Officers cover. You do not want an event like the Fire Department experienced last year to be the trigger to provide for the safety of our Officers and Residents that the City warrants.

We should immediately bump starting pay in the \$58,000-62,000 range.

We should provide scholarships for those qualified and interested to com-

plete the required Florida Police Academy training and those seeking a degree in Criminal Justice. Required continued employment and/or pay back should be required.

We should EXCEED whatever we negotiate for the Firefighters for those Police who desire to seek a degree or additional training.

Fire Department question as to staffing as the Chief indicated hiring 9 new Firefighters for Station 6. This station has been manned for at least the last three years. When you drive by the current station you typically see 3-4 vehicles, hence they are already staffed at 3-4 Firefighters.

Fire Department question as to all the times Captain Maynard's name came up as having responsibility for. One person hav-

A local preservation ordinance is simply a next step. I'm proud of the work of Greg Mellowe with his recent approval for the Lockhart Community Marker from the Florida Division of Historical Resources. He completed the significant amount of paperwork while I funded the marker. If a countywide preservation ordinance had been placing this process would have been less precarious and erecting additional markers would have already been erected in District 2. I don't know about you, but I believe more markers are needed throughout the county. Every area of town

deserves preservation of its historical resources.

It is time to remedy this historic preservation deficiency in the county and cities of Apopka and Ocoee.

Once a preservation ordinance, board, and non-profit organization is created, the Division of Historical Resources recommends becoming a certified local government. This opens the door for technical assistance and training. Opportunities become available for submission into the National Register of Historic Places. And again, the ability to apply and receive funding grants is immense. In Central Florida the following cities are certified:

Winter Park, Orlando, Eatonville, Mt. Dora, Eustis, Sanford, Kissimmee and St. Cloud.

Attending the Florida Main Street Conference opened my eyes to these additional processes and designations to improve our ability to preserve local history. Looking at the success of the above listed cities proves that success is a series of intentional actions and activities. I believe it is time to join them and become a *Certified Local Government* and pass a *Preservation Ordinance*. Please help me by advocating with city and county commissioners for the establishment of these successful tools

# State’s citrus industry’s production is down after hurricanes, disease

A new report shows that Florida’s citrus industry’s production is down considerably after being ravaged by hurricanes and disease.

The latest Economic and Market Research report from Florida Citrus shows that total orange juice sales, as of June 2023, have fallen by 11.6 percent compared to the previous year, while the price has increased by 12.3 percent.

The Florida citrus report also shows the stark difference between seasons for orange juice yields. For the four weeks ending mid-June 2023, Florida growers produced 25.1 million gallons of orange juice, including frozen, reconstituted and blended varieties.

For the same period in 2022, a total of 29.4 million gallons of orange juice was produced, a 14.5 percent drop for the current season.

According to a recent report from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, during the 2021-22 citrus season Florida produced 41.2 million boxes of oranges. However, the 2022-23 season is projected to produce 15.9 million boxes of oranges.

The USDA report data shows that during the 2018-19 season, there were 49.7 million fruit-bearing trees, yielding around 813 fruit per tree for non-Valencia varieties,

213 per tree for navel oranges and 608 per tree for Valencia.

In comparison, the 2022-23 season forecasts project that there are now around 43.9 million fruit-bearing trees, with yields for non-Valencia varieties at 474 fruit per tree, 106 per tree for navel and 323 per tree for Valencia.

Hurricanes and disease are two major factors for declining yields in fruit and by extension, orange juice. In September 2022, Hurricane Ian ripped through 375,000 acres of citrus groves. The cost to growers is an estimated \$675 million, according to the state Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Approximately \$65 million has been appropriated for research and to replace damaged trees.

Meanwhile, citrus greening — which is a disease that can kill the tree and its fruit — has spread throughout the Florida citrus groves and the effect is fewer yields every year. Also known as yellow dragon disease, a disease-carrying insect spreads citrus greening — the Asian citrus psyllid — and there is no cure once a tree is infected.

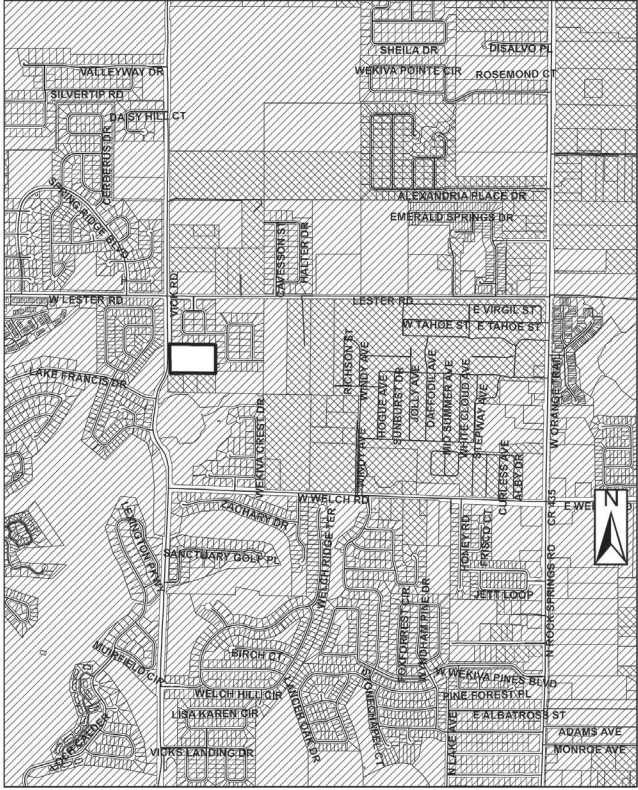
Infected trees produce bitter, green fruit that cannot be sold or used for juice. The disease is also prevalent in California, Georgia, Louisiana, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Texas and the U.S. Virgin Islands and threatens the entire U.S. citrus industry.

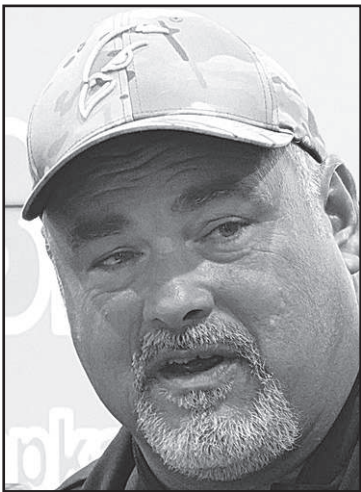

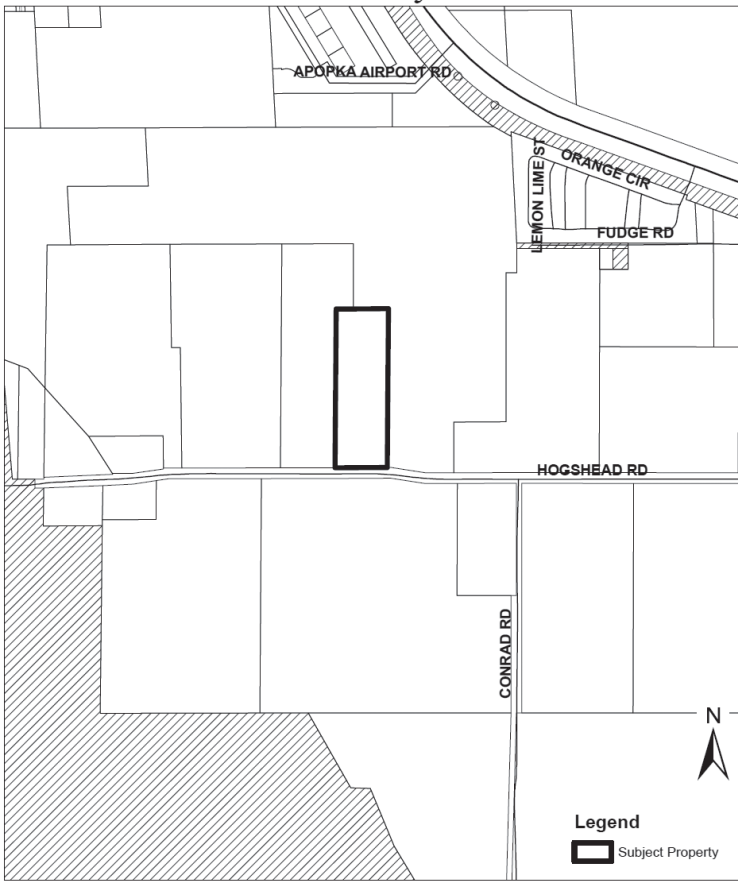


Apopka head football coach Jeff Rolson speaks Monday, July 24, during the media day event held in the Varsity Club at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.

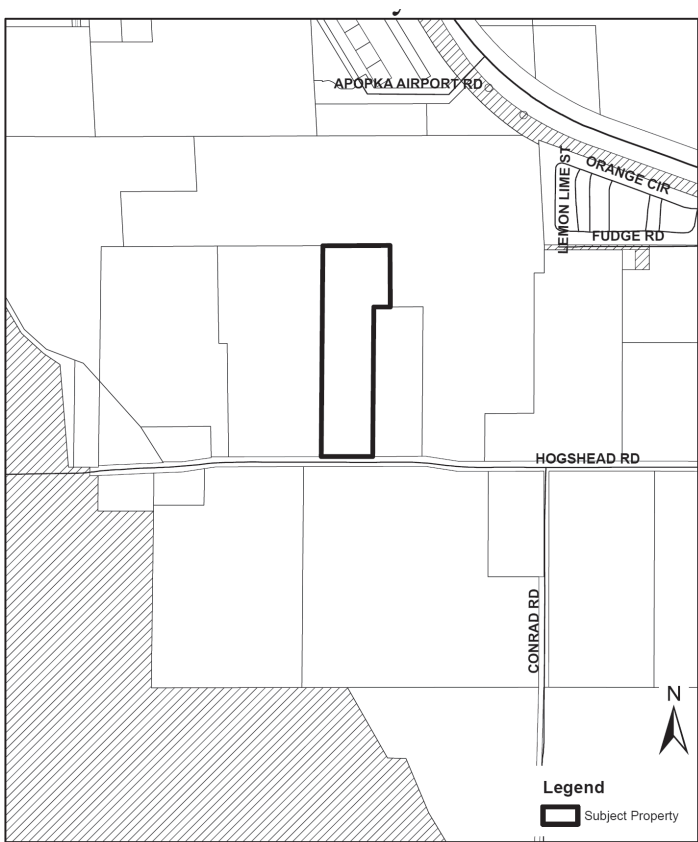
