Apopka attorney announces run for mayor

Matt Aungst calls Nelson, Moore 'career politicians'

Attorney Matthew Aungst announced Monday his campaign for Apopka mayor, becoming the third candidate join the race after Orange County District 2 Commissioner Christine

Moore and incumbent Mayor Bryan Nelson.

Aungst, an Apopka resident since 2017 whose law office is located in the city, said when he sent out flyers that said "Make Apopka Great Again," he didn't have any intention to run as the third candidate.

The intent behind "Make Apopka Great Again" which included circulating mailers, billboards and a Facebook page — was to create buzz in the community and to get someone to run

as the third candidate against Nelson and Moore, whom Aungst called career politi-

Nelson was District 2 commissioner before running and winning his first mayoral term in 2018 and won his second term in 2022. Moore is now serving her second term as District 2 commissioner.

"It was me reaching out as a private voter, a private citizen, and saying, 'Let's talk about this," Aungst

said in an Aug. 4 interview. "I think that the feedback and the discussion that happened online was very fruitful, and after talking to several people in the community and them encouraging me to do it myself."

Aungst said his top three priorities, if elected, are to maintain infrastructure, which he views as inadequate; to get the city budget under control so money isn't taken from the reserves

highly talented professionals to work "as a team."

"We have to get some serious professionals in some of these department head positions," Aungst said. "I think we have to address infrastructure, because what we have now is currently failing or about to fail, but we've also got a ton of growth, and I don't think the infrastruc-

City considers policy to explain comp

The city of Apopka doesn't have a formal methodology for calculating commissioners' compensation, but the Apopka City Council is hoping to establish a formal policy to govern their annual pay, which is currently set at \$17,400 per commissioner.

Joseph Patton, the city's human resources director, presented a study on commissioners' salaries at the Aug. 6 City Council meeting. He said the city doesn't have a methodology in place to determine Apopka city commissioners' pay.

"We are unable to locate any records, ordinances, compensation, methodology on anything concern-

ing Commissioner compensation," Patton told the City Council. "So, in the past, we've gotten an email from the city administrator's office saying, 'This is the new salary,' which I did not know, or anyone knows what the computation was."

As for Apopka city commissioners, their salaries were \$13,500 in fiscal year (FY) 2019. They increased to \$15,900 in FY20 and to \$16,200 in FY21. Most recently, the salaries went up to \$17,400 in FY23. The vice mayor receives an additional \$300.

He said he located Ordinance No. 781 dated July 7, 1993, which amended the City Charter and included in it section 2.03, "Compensa-

Demings signs updated county agreement with ICE

State AG warns of mayor, commissioners' removal if not signed

Orange County Mayor Jerry L. Demings signed an updated agreement with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) in response to State Attorney General James Uthmeier's warning that Demings and all county commissioners could be removed from office if the addendum were not adopted.

By signing the addendum, Demings authorizes county law enforcement officers to transport detainees from Orange County jails to ICE detention centers.

After signing the addendum early Friday morning, Demings took the document to the Orange County Board of County Commissioners, which ratified it on Tuesday.

Speaking at a Friday news conference, Demings

defended the signing, saying it was a "calculated risk" the county had to take.

"Yes, I signed the damn thing because we really had to. [We were] put in a tough spot," Demings said. "I can't let our entire Board of County Commissioners and myself be removed from office. I say that with all sincerity, because of the role, the responsibilities that we have here within this community, to take care of our community and look out for our residents. I did not want to be

in a position where the governor will have the opportunity to insert his minions in the roles to lead this county."

Demings said that the agreement does not immediately require correctional officers to transport ICE detainees because it would depend on ICE's request and the county's operational readiness. He said Orange County's operational readiness is impacted by the county's 24% vacancy rate

Maters & Taters to close soon

Apopka landmark selling produce until property sale

After almost 41 years in business, Maters & Taters Market & Creamery will shut its doors soon, pending the sale of the prop-

Maters & Taters sits in a bright blue building on the intersection of North Park Avenue and East Summit Street, across from Apopka Memorial Middle School. Inside, guests can find produce and meat from California, Georgia, and beyond.

"A lot of customers like coming here to get the produce because they say it stays fresher and tastes better than supermarkets' [produce]," store manager Andy Ray said.

Maters' arrival on the real estate market is largely due to former owner Jeff Boyer's unexpected death on Oct. 10, 2024. Boyer began managing the produce stand in 2000, striving to unite convenience with quality.

"That was really his dream—to be able to be a one-stop shop, to be in competition with all the big stores," longtime employee Debbie Martin said.

Martin credits Boyer for expanding the space and selection of his parents' market. When Sherman and Marilyn Boyer opened the Apopka location in 1984, they closed their produce stands in Forest City and Winter Park. But the Apopka store only had a small bakery and rows of produce.

"We didn't have all the refrigerated cases," Martin said. "Everything would have to come out of the cooler and be displayed

in the morning and then picked up and put back in the cooler every night."

Jeff Boyer expanded the store's selection by bringing in milk, meat and frozen vegetables. He also converted the garage into an Amish ice cream parlor approxi-

Want good schools? Send good students

School starts next week, but there's already plenty of talk about grades. The districts and the schools got their report cards earlier in the

For those who didn't get high enough grades, there is still the devil to pay, but these days the teachers get the bill. If

they show up for pre-planning at a "C" school, I am betting they have a big pile of worries waiting for them. Been there, done that.

I taught at a school that, for lack of a better word, under-excelled one year. The instructional staff was put through the wringer for months, attending extra meetings on top of the already-too frequent meetings, sitting through data chats, having our noses rubbed in numbers and our lesson plans reviewed. Fingers were pointed, fists were shaken, well-paid people from the district walked up and down hallways looking sternly at teachers.

Everybody was on the hot seat except the kids who got the numbers. And their parents. All the focus was on how much effort was being put into the teaching, none on the effort being put into the learning. Nobody was asking "what kind of kids got these grades?" Believe me, it matters.

You can't teach a kid to ride a bicycle if he doesn't want to ride a bicycle. You can put him on the seat, tie his feet to the pedals and push him down a hill, but the rest is up to him. This situation is further complicated by parents who don't want their kids getting their knees skinned.

That's a metaphor, by the way. Have you ever discussed metaphors with your child, maybe while reading regularly with him or her? If so, you probably don't have to worry about whether the school is an "A" or a "C." Your kids are going to turn out fine.

Or are you more likely to go down

to the school and holler at the teacher and the principal because your child got a "C," while not even being aware that the test was about metaphors? Some parents do that. They think the learning is none of their business and only care about the grade. Some don't care about either part.

If you get enough of that kind of parents sending you that kind of students, you might be getting to the reason why some schools don't get an "A." Teachers matter, but there's only so much they can do.

The way it works was explained to me over 60 years ago by Principal Stanley Underwood. I think he finally got tired of beating some of us with a board, so he tried to talk a little sense

He told a story about a country store where the local loafers hung out. They sat on the porch and whittled and played checkers and got in the way, but they never bought anything.

One day the storekeeper got fed up with the situation and came out and started giving them bills. "Seth, you owe \$2.39 for canned goods. Farley, I'm charging you \$4 for a sack of grain. You need to pay two bucks for produce, George..."

All the loafers started protesting. "Hey, wait a minute...we didn't get

The storekeeper said, "well, it's all in there for you. It ain't my fault if you don't pick it up!"

The school is like a grocery store. You drop your kids off, teachers show them which aisles the goods are on and help them get to stuff on shelves they can't reach. Those shelves are well stocked.

If you're not checking what your little shoppers put in their cart, don't blame the grocer.

Applications now open for city's new grant program

The City Council approved a unique, non-profit grant program to support our local non-profit organizations providing services to our community with a focus on our youth, those at risk, and our senior citizens.

The city has committed \$100,000 dollars for this fiscal year, which ends Sept. 30 and has in the budget for the 2025-26 year an additional \$100,000 to continue the grant program.

The grant award ranges from \$500 to \$5,000 with a 50% match. The match cannot come from commissioner's discretionary funds but in-kind goods, services or cash can be counted toward the match. Applicants must be in existence for at least a year, though the scoring criteria favors seasoned non-profits.

Administrative requirements for grant recipients include progress reports on the program's objectives and outcomes as well as performance objectives showing the number of participants helped and number of hours served. A financial report is required with a detailed breakdown of expenses submitted on a quarterly basis.

The city maintains the right to request a financial audit to be Apopka Mayor

sure the funds are being spent appropriately within the terms of the service agreement. Funds can be used for direct services, including: new program initiatives, community collaborations and partnerships, direct assistance to targeted populations, educational and outreach activities, operating equipment and electronics valued at \$1,000 or less, and costs related to background checks for staff and vol-

Grants may not be used for supplementing the regular operating budget, replacing other sources of operational funding, supporting non-profit individuals or entities, entertainment expenses, indirect administrative costs, and purchasing goods or services unrelated to the program's goals, or electronic hardware valued at over \$1,000.

The grant submission must be received no later than Aug. 29, and late submissions will not be considered. The proposal must be submitted electronically, must contain a financial disclosure statement, proof of nonprofit status, liability insurance, list of board members, and letters of support from outside city government.

No changes can be made after the submission deadline. The applications will be vetted by city staff for completeness and accuracy and the qualified applicants will be provided to the grant review panel for review. The grant review panelists were nominated by each of the City Council members to review and score each applicant.

A public scoring meeting will be held with the panel to finalize their award recommendations to the council. The City Council will then approve the final award list at its next meeting.

The selection criteria includes proposal content, years of service, grant match, and benefit to the city of Apopka. For nonprofits interested in applying for the grant, visit apopka.gov/Non-ProfitGrant.

Remember county guidelines when fertilizing your grass

Many fertilizers contain nitrogen and phosphorus, also known as nutrients. However, pollution from the use of these nutrients harms our natural waterbodies — springs, lakes and rivers — by causing algae blooms and poor water qual-

When yards are overfertilized, the excess nitrogen and phosphorus flows with rainwater into the same stormwater system designed to keep our property and roads from flooding during heavy rain. By doing something as simple as choosing fertilizer carefully and applying it properly, together we can make a big impact on the health of our natural water bodies.

As you likely know, we're currently in the restricted season of fertilizer use. No fertilizer containing nitrogen or phosphorous may be applied in Orange County from June 1 through Sept. 30.

Year-round we have the following rules in our county:

All areas of property covered by lawn, turf and landscape plants are subject to the fertilizer ordinance.

Deflector shields must be in place when broadcast spreaders are used next to streets, inlets, ditches, conveyances, and waterways.

No fertilizer or grass clip-



pings shall be deposited on streets, driveways, or in storm

No fertilizer can be applied within 25 feet from wa-

Application sites should maintain a 10-foot low maintenance zone — planted area with no fertilizing, mowing, or maintenance — adjacent to water bodies.

No fertilizer shall be applied when the National Weather Service issues any advisory for a severe thunderstorm, flood, tropical storm, or hurricane.

City Council greenlights annexing 39 acres for new development

Commissioners also approved vacating section right-of-way for Paulucci Acres

The Apopka City Council unanimously greenlit annexing 39 acres for Paulucci Acres, a proposed mixeduse development that will include 1,000 single-family residences and townhomes as well as non-residential

The annexation's second reading and approval was done at the Aug. 6 City Council meeting. The annexation's first reading was approved at the council's July 16 meeting.

The 39-acre land is situated on the east side of Vick Road, approximately a quarter of a mile north of the Vick Road and West Lester Road intersection. The parcel is owned by Paulucci Acres LLC. Pulte Homes is the project's builder.

As a separate action item, the City Council also approved a resolution, which would vacate a rightof-way for the planned de-

Specifically, the resolution vacates the northern 20 feet of a 40-foot-wide, unimproved public rightof-way and a 40-foot-wide north-south section of the same right-of-way north of Woodside Ridge Drive and Misty Glen Circle. The vacated right-of-way is estimated at 1.52 acres.

The resolution vote was previously tabled at the July 16 City Council meeting.

"It's what we call a paper right-of-way, meaning it was platted at one point in time but never improved," city planner Bobby Howell told the City Council on Aug. 6. "So you would never know it was there if you went out and saw it in real life."

Howell explained that according to the project applicant, the future Paulucci Acres homeowners association will enter into a maintenance agreement with the city regarding the southern 20 feet of right-of-way that will remain after the property is developed.

This condition will be added to the planned development, Howell said.

The applicant on record is Daniel O'Keefe, partner with the law firm Shutts &

Utility providers AT&T, Lumen, Duke Energy, Comcast and Lake Apopka Natural Gas District told the city they have no objection to the abandonment of rightof-way. These companies' email messages and letters confirming their lack of objection were included in the Aug. 6 City Council agenda package.

Pulte and Shutts & Bowen held a private community meeting concerning the Paulucci Acres project at 6 p. m. on Monday at the Apopka Community Center, according to a July 18 notice shared by the Apopka Critic. Approximately 30 people were in attendance when The Apopka Chief arrived. Since the meeting was exclusive to neighboring property owners, the Chief did not attend the meeting.

"Developer representatives for the Paulucci Acres project showed residents the new plan for roadway improvements to Ponkan and Vick Roads," the Apopka Critic said in a Facebook post about the community meeting. "The new plan is to close the Pitman Road, Ponkan intersection at the dangerous curve."

Other updates from uted to this article.

the evening included a new roundabout and new curbing, sidewalks and lighting for Ponkan Road. Orange County District 2 Commissioner Christine Moore, and Apopka City Commissioners Diane Velazquez, Nadia Anderson and Nick Nesta attended the meeting.

During public comment at the Aug. 6 council meeting, resident Rod Olsen said he attended the Monday meeting. While he said the Paulucci Acres meeting was very well done, he said he remained concerned about how new developments will impact existing infrastruc-

Olsen also said the city needed better infrastructure management and needed to hold developers accountable for infrastructure connectiv-

"We need to look at better ways of managing this process and holding the developers accountable ... for the connectivity so we don't run into the issue," he said. "[Apopka City] Commissioner [Alexander H.] Smith pointed out where we got this new development, and we don't have safe sidewalks to and from schools."





City Council adopts meeting minutes policy

Minutes to focus on actions, not discussion

The Apopka City Council voted 4-1 on adopting a resolution standardizing meeting minutes for consistency and accuracy, with Commissioner Nick Nesta in opposition.

At the Wednesday meeting, City Clerk Susan Bone introduced Resolution 2025-33, which proposed a meeting minutes style that would focus on action, including who made the motion, seconded it,

the results of the vote taken, and the names of the people who gave public comment.

Bone said she researched other municipalities' meeting minutes policies and discovered they reflect the action style of minutes. She also reviewed Robert's Rules of Order for conducting meetings.

She acknowledged that at the July 16 City Council meeting, the mayor and commissioners discussed her writing a policy but never voted on it. However, she felt that it was important for her office to craft a policy.

"Basically, what I want to do is try to lessen the amount of discussion and - not necessarily discussion, but the back and forth talking and things like that in the meeting minutes," Bone told the City Council on Wednesday.

Bone said she wrote the resolution with a focus on adhering to Florida Statutes 286.011, pertaining to public meetings and records. She said the law require minutes to be brief and not be verbatim.

"The minutes of a meeting of any such board or commission of any such state agency or authority shall be promptly recorded, and such records shall be open to public inspection," Florida Statutes 286.011 states.

sioner Diane Velazquez praised Bone for writing the meeting minutes policy, mentioning that a clear policy is needed for reference.

Nesta noted that the Council voted 3-2 on July 16 in opposition to city attorney Cliff Shepard drafting a meeting minutes policy for later presentation. Nesta and Velazquez voted for it; Commissioners Nadia Anderson and Alexander H. Smith, and Mayor Bryan Nelson op-

Nesta said Bone drafting a policy goes against the council's will and criticized how Shepard still reviewed the resolution for a fee when

he could have written it in the first place.

Nesta said he couldn't vote for the resolution because of a lack of consistency in applying decorum rules.

"The games that are played non-stop up here, with agendas and minutes and things of that," Nesta said, "I mean, it's just, what's next? I just, I can't see it, so that, yes, I appreciate there's a policy. Is it the right policy, and one that our attorney created? No, so I can't vote for this."

mately five years ago, Martin said. Since the local schoolchildren were not allowed inside after classes let out each day, he also built ice cream and candy windows.

But children were not their only ice cream custom-

"The adults really bought as much or more ice cream than the kids did," Martin said.

On August 20, 2024, however, Jeff underwent heart surgery for his mitral and aortic valves, according to a GoFundMe for the Boyer family.

"Jeff faced a complete heart blockage that caused him to have an abnormal heart rhythm, which resulted in him having a pacemaker placed," GoFundMe organizer Kaitlynn Lovejoy said. "Jeff was in the ICU at AdventHealth for four weeks,

then transitioned to PCU [progressive care unit]."

Upon his discharge from PCU, Jeff lived at what is now Aviata at Rosewood, a rehabilitation center in northwest Orlando. He died after only one week.

"When he died, that dream died," Martin said.

But Ray, Jeff's stepson, wanted to keep it alive. After working for Maters for two years, Ray became the new manager.

"His idea was to teach

me to run the business," Ray said. "He was going to retire, and him and my mom were going to travel."

Unfortunately, Jeff died before he could teach Ray the business, so Ray had to teach himself. After finding a Rolodex with all the vendors' phone numbers, Ray called each one and asked how Jeff typically handled their orders. But the customer loss was hard to recover from.

"When [Jeff's] parents had it and they died, he lost customers, too, so he had to build the customer count back up," Ray said. "But summertime is always slow, and it's just hard to get everything back on track."

As a result, Maters no longer serves ice cream, and Ray expects Maters to close in the near future.

"I don't see it selling as another produce stand," Mar-

tin said. "Being in a small business nowadays is very difficult, because there's so much competition, and you can always go somewhere and get it cheaper — maybe not better, but cheaper."

Upon Maters' closure, Ray said he might find another job in produce, while Martin is considering volunteer work. But both agree that the memories and relationships they have formed through Maters will be difficult to re-

The longtime customers who remember Sherman and Marilyn, for example, still talk about Marilyn's banana bread, which she used to make with leftover bananas from the store. And Martin has also seen a new generation of Maters lovers grow up.

"I've had moms that I'd seen come in when they were pregnant," Martin said. "Now, just today, a mom came in and her son drove her here."

Customers will often recognize Maters employees outside of the store, as well.

"One of my little middle school kids at church asked me the other day, 'Miss Debbie, why is Maters & Taters closing?" Martin said. "She was very disappointed."

Until Maters is officially sold, however, Martin and Ray will continue selling their Tennessee tomatoes, scuppernongs, and the other groceries customers crave.

"We just gotta keep going till we can't go no more," Ray said. "Just keep on going."

ture we currently have is suitable for the growth that we have coming, let alone what we already have is failing."

Aungst said the city currently needs leadership in the mayor, leadership by team, and transparency and modernization of how information is disseminated, such as what needs to be made public on the city website that isn't published on the site.

"I think that what we

have right now is a bunch of people that work in the administration who are very fearful in the way that they do the jobs," he said. "I think that we do need accountability. And I think those people who work for the city, who work with excellence and produce with excellence... they're doing a great job. I think that we need to quit micromanaging all of the city workers and the city

staff and let them do the job that they're capable of doing."

To further ensure his obligation is to citizens, Aungst said he will wholly self-fund his campaign and not accept contributions from anyone.

"The greatest threat to a career politician is an opponent who cannot be financially influenced," Aungst said in his Aug. 4 statement announcing his mayoral campaign. "I will oppose any proposal to use Apopka's tax dollars to fund programs that primarily benefit individuals from outside of our community. Such initiatives are an irresponsible use of our resources and place long-term burdens on our local services and our community."

Aungst holds a bachelor's degree in finance from the University of Central Florida, and a juris doctorate and master of business administration from Florida State University. As an attorney, he practices personal injury protection litigation and represents plaintiffs in other types of civil cases. He is the father of three children.

Nelson and Moore were the only two candidates in the mayoral race until William Dabbs, an information technology professional, launched a brief campaign

but dropped out of the race in early July.

Dabbs said in a previous interview with The Apopka Chief that he was not affiliated with the "Make Apopka Great Again" billboards and

among its corrections offi-

cers. What's more, the agreement was actually written for law enforcement agencies, not correctional agencies, Demings said. Orange County is one of Florida's few counties that manages and operates its jail; usually, that job is reserved for the sheriff.

For Orange County correctional officers to manage transporting detainees, they would need specialized training.

Uthmeier sent a July 29 letter to Demings and all six county commissioners via postal mail. They received it Aug. 1 morning, leading to the prompt addendum signing. Uthmeier also posted this letter on X.

Demings said the agreement was between Orange County and the federal government, but "somehow the state inserted itself into the process, but that's who the agreement is with, and so I believe that common sense will prevail when they are presented with all the facts."

Orange County was never a sanctuary county, and its officials believe in lawful immigration, the mayor said.

"We have never, through resolution or otherwise from our Board of County Commissioners, agreed to adopt sanctuary types of policies," Demings said.

According to Uthmeier's letter, the state attorney general learned that on June 26, Demings had directed Orange County Corrections to reject the ICE and the Florida Sheriffs Association's addendum that would change the county's existing 287(g) Warrant Service Officer agreement.

"By rejecting this addendum presented by ICE and Florida Sheriffs, you adopted a sanctuary policy and failed to exercise best efforts in support of the enforcement of federal immigration

law," Uthmeier wrote. The letter gives further details about how "illegal aliens represent an obvious danger to the County," men-

tioning two incidents of arrests this year.

According to the letter, last January, Florida Highway Patrol arrested one undocumented immigrant for hitting and killing a 6-yearold child from Orange County. Last February, the Orange County Sheriff's Office and the Osceola County Sheriff's Office arrested five Columbian nationals

who were involved in a series of residential burglaries and connected to several burglaries across the U.S.

If Orange County doesn't adopt the addendum, the state would sue or even remove all members of the Board of County Commissioners from office, according to the letter.

Hope CommUnity Center, an Apopka-based immigrations advocacy group, and the Immigrants Are Welcome Here coalition denounced Demings' decision to sign the updated ICE agreement.

"By doing so, Mayor Demings becomes complicit with the human rights atrocities being committed at these centers, including the already infamous Alligator Alcatraz," Felipe Sousa-Lazaballet, executive director of Hope CommUnity Center, said in a Aug. 1 statement.

Sousa-Lazaballet said Demings acknowledged the county's lack of capacity to transport jail detainees to ICE facilities and that this would be the federal government's job.

"Hope CommUnity Center stands firmly against any collaboration between local governments and ICE," Sousa-Lazaballet said. "These agreements do not make our communities safer; they make our immigrant neighbors more vulnerable and erode trust in local institutions."

On March 25, the Board of County Commissioners voted 5–2 to ratify the agreement for the county to participate in the WSO Program. District 5 Commissioner Kelly Martinez Semrad and District 1 Commissioner Nicole Wilson voted against the measure.

On Tuesday, Semrad and Wilson both voted against the ICE agreement addendum as well.

Demings has repeatedly said Orange County's role in enforcing immigration laws is not to enforce them on behalf of the federal government but to provide the jails for individuals brought into custody.

"We didn't really have a choice," Commissioner Christine Moore told The Apopka Chief in March. "It's federal law and state law, and our attorney said that we needed to cooperate with the legal authorities. The governor said if we didn't, we would all be removed from office."

St. Johns District to award up to \$60K for schools' STEM projects

WHS aquaponics garden is a five-time grant recipient

The St. Johns River Water Management District's (SJRWMD) Blue School Grant Program is awarding up to \$60,000 this 2025—26 school year to support hands-on, water-focused STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) projects for kindergarten through 12th grade classrooms.

The Blue School Grant Program awards up to \$3,000 per teacher or school, and supports STEM projects, equipment, supplies, field trips and more.

From aquaponics systems to water quality testing and environmental field trips, these grants help students get in touch with real-world science and become future water stewards.

"The Blue School Grant

gives teachers the tools to engage students in real world learning about water quality, conservation and protection," Danielle FitzPatrick, SJRW-MD media coordinator, said in a July 29 phone interview with The Apopka Chief. "The goal is really to create handson experiences so the students remember they are our future water stewards, and so we want them to be empowered and protect and preserve our water resources for the future."

Since 2016, over 115 projects have been funded, supporting 85 schools and benefiting more than 15,000 students, FitzPatrick said.

Last year's budget was \$60,000, with some money left over, and SJRWMD aims to award all funds this year to support teachers in educating students about Florida's water resources, FitzPatrick said

"So this year we're making we really want to award every dollar to teachers who are helping students connect [with] the importance of

Florida's water resources," FitzPatrick said.

Hai-Anh Nguyen, a math teacher at Wekiva High School, has received the Blue School Grant money five times since 2016 to build and maintain an aquaponics gar-

den on the school site.

The aquaponics garden includes raised beds using fish waste, rainwater harvesting systems, and a butterfly garden. Half of the system was converted to saltwater for growing red mangroves

in partnership with UCF's Coastal and Estuarine Ecology Lab.

The frequency of SJRW-MD representatives visiting schools that have received Blue School grants is not based on a schedule but depends on the schools contacting SJRWMD, FitzPatrick said. The last time St. Johns representatives visited Wekiva High School aquaponics garden was in March 2024, she added.

"If there's a field trip or, in Ms. Nguyen's case, a class-room learning experience going on, then we try to make an effort to get out there if we can," FitzPatrick said.

When asked what the most unique STEM projects a school has applied to the Blue School Grant Program for, FitzPatrick said Nguyen's aquaponics garden was one of them, given the Wekiva High School educator's background as a math teacher

"Most of the time it's science teachers who apply for these projects, but I think she just shows that you can be any kind of teacher and incorporate water resources in your teaching," FitzPatrick said.

FitzPatrick illustrated another interesting project that was funded by the Blue School Grant: A teacher from Wedgefield K-8 School in Orlando partnered with Four Roots Farms, also in Orlando, to teach students about sustainable gardening and water conservation.

The Apopka Chief was unable to reach Nguyen for comment by deadline.

The Blue School Grant application window opened on Friday, Aug. 1, and will continue until Sept. 21 at 11:59 p. m.

Grantees are notified at the end of October, funds would be awarded in early January 2026, project activity period would take place from January to June 1, 2026, and final report and documentation are due to SJRWMD by June 1 at 5 p. m., according to the SJRWMD Blue School Grant website.





tion; expenses of council."

Section 2.03 of the city charter states the commissioners shall receive a salary, that any changes in compensation don't go into effect until after the next regular election following a vote to change pay. However, the section doesn't specify the methodology for determining the salary amounts or changes to pay.

The section also states that the mayor and commissioners will be reimbursed for expenses incurred while performing their duties. Per the charter, the mayor's salary is set in the yearly budget.

While presenting his study, Patton discussed commissioners' compensation in surrounding cities and a few outside the Central Florida area, ranging from \$8,700 to \$79,343 per year.

In comparing compensation, Patton also examined the city's population, the number of commissioners per capita, whether the city was districted or non-districted, and whether the city offered com-

missioners health insurance. Vice Modes not offer its commissioners health insurance. Sioner Diane of Sioner D

Mayor Bryan Nelson asked if any of the surveyed cities receive a salary bump based on population growth. Patton said methods differ among cities. Vice Mayor/Commissioner Diane Velazquez said she was somewhat glad the issue of codifying the compensation methodology is being raised, especially since over the years, the city's population is growing, and commissioners are becoming in-

volved in the community and

"We used to, they used to just show up and kind of vote, but I think over the years, we have grown," Velazquez said. "Each commissioner, we're basically at almost every community event. Commissioner Nadia Anderson said she had received several questions about how commissioners were getting paid.

"I was the one who brought it up and asked, 'Was there an ordinance or policy that showed how commissioners was paid?" she said. "It wasn't that I was wanting us to receive a raise. I just needed a policy so I could explain to the residents, and there was no policy."

Patton recommended setting up a workshop or business item at the next City Council meeting to discuss compensation methodology, after which the city could draft an ordinance.

A workshop has been set up for 6 p. m. Oct. 15., before the second City Council meeting that month, at the Apopka City Hall council chamber.

Commissioner Nick Nesta asked Patton about the specifics of health insurance plans for commissioners in other cities.

Patton said commissioners that received health insurance would likely have the same options as regular city employees, including choosing between HMO and PPO plans.



Apopka to announce new baseball coach this week

The Apopka High School administration and athletic department told The Apopka Chief this week that they are days away from announcing the hiring of a new head coach for the baseball team.

Aaron Crawford, Apopka High School's athletic director, told The Apopka Chief that the school received a lot of interest in the position, and ultimately interviewed five

applicants. Crawford said that the applicants had dif-

ferent levels of playing and coaching experience.

On Monday, Crawford said that Apopka tentatively planned to make the official announcement on Thursday or Friday. Crawford said he couldn't share any more information about the applicant until they clear the human resources process.

"We've made the offer, and we will have the official release of the name by the end of the week," Crawford said. "It has been a long and tedious process, because we have many qualified candidates, and we wanted to make sure that we were making the right choice for the program and the community."

Apopka's former head coach, Bobby Brewer, left the program at the start of June, citing a loss of joy as his reason for stepping down. Brewer had been at the helm of the program for six seasons, amassing a 91–48 record, a 2022 Regional Semifinal appearance, and three District

Championship appearances.

Brewer said the most significant reason behind his resignation was that it was no longer as enjoyable for him as it used to be. He said the joy he has gotten from working with his players has been what has kept him here for so long, but he wants a new perspective.

"You got to have fun doing this," Brewer said. "And again, it's just to the point where things ain't like they used to be. I love being a Blue Darter. I really enjoyed my time with the players, and I really enjoyed my time with the parents who supported the programs. And sometimes it only takes a few things or people to make it not. And I'm just not having any fun."

After stepping away from the Apopka job, Brewer found another head coaching position at Ocoee High School. Now Bobby Brewer

Apopka, Wekiva to host Titans for Kickoff Classic

Apopka, Wekiva facing similar challenges in 2025

Just one week away from the start of the fall high school football season and both of Apopka's hometown teams, the Apopka Blue Darters and the Wekiva Mustangs, are preparing for the 2025 campaign.

While it may not be Week 1, next week marks the annual preseason games known as the Kickoff Classic.

On Aug. 15, Apopka will play Tampa Bay Titans for the second year in a row and will host the game this year. Wekiva will be facing off against the Olympia Titans and will also host the game. Both games are set to start at 7 p. m.

Apopka vs. Tampa Bay

According to MaxPreps, the Tampa Bay Titans have a preseason ranking of 23rd in the state. They finished the 2024 season with a 9–3 record. Tampa Bay Tech scored 456 points and allowed 192. Apopka, on the other hand, has a preseason ranking of 56th in the state, having finished the 2024 season with a 4–6 record. The Blue Darters scored 127 points and allowed 129.

In last year's preseason matchup, Tampa Bay dominated the Blue Darters 38–7. The Blue Darters collected 222 yards, 195 of which were rushing yards.

Apopka's offense in that game was a preview of what

it would look like for the rest of the season — run-heavy, with lots of yards and multiple scoring opportunities. Apopka had three turnovers against Tampa Bay, two fumbles and one interception.

Last year, Apopka had its worst season in 20 years, scoring its lowest number of points in over two decades (127 points or 12.7 points a game). But the Blue Darters' new head coach for the 2025 season, Marcus Neeson, has a new offensive game plan.

He said he wants to simplify the offense. He has reduced the number of formations and further streamlined offense by keeping play calls simple.

However, a significant difference in the Blue Darter offense this season will be the presence of a new quar-

terback.

Apopka's starting quarterback for the last three years, Tyson Davison, transferred to Ocoee High School over the off-season. Now, Apopka's offense truly has a new beginning with a new scheme and a new leader at the quarterback position.

Neeson said he has still not made a final decision on the starting quarterback as of Wednesday.

Defensively, Apopka was torched by the Tampa Bay Titans last year as they put up 180 rushing yards and 175 passing yards.

Apopka's run defense is always stout, but last year against Tampa Bay, even that wasn't solid. This year, Neeson said the Blue Darters' defensive line group looks like the best group on the team, thanks to defensive line

coach Matt Anderson.

Tampa Bay has been a state championship-caliber team for the last four years and had 23 juniors on its squad last year. The Titans will be more experienced and larger overall compared to Apopka.

Apopka is in the process of rebuilding back from a disastrous 2024 season, having lost 28 players in six months, as well as its head coach. However, Neeson said he has a great deal of confidence in his team.

Wekiva vs. Olympia Titans

Keir also had big bass of the tournament which weighed in at 6.20 pounds. I would have to say that's a good job with all the

hot days we've been havin'.

I don't know what's goin' on down at Lake Kissimmee, but folks're gettin' on the water at 6:30 each mornin' and they're catchin' their limit of bluegills and shellcrackers by 9 a. m. I've seen bookoos of podcasts that folks're makin', and they're catchin' panfish like they're goin' out of style down there.

So get you some red worms or grass shrimp, and find some lily pads. Those ol' bluegills and shellcrackers are in the pads just stayin' out of the sun. If you want to have some fun, get your long poles ready and get out there and catch'ya some.

The bass fishin' on the Harris Chain is about the same. You just need to get on the water real early or late evenin' after the rains. Try fishin' a top water bait early around the vegetation like Kissimmee grass and lily pads. Once that ol' sun gets up, try fishin' in deeper water where the submerged eelgrass and hydrilla is healthy and green. You can also try fishin' the shell beds and fish attractors throughout the chain. The Harris Chain has a lotta docks throughout the chain, and those docks can hold some bass durin' the summer.

West Lake Toho is fishin' good early in the mornin'. Folks're catchin' some nice bass on shiners fished around the grass line and vegetation. You can catch some bass around the hydrilla by fishin' a speed worm real slow or just flippin' the thick clumps of hydrilla.

Folks're catchin' some bass in the Maitland Chain fishin' the submerged hydrilla and eelgrass. Plastic worms and slow sinkin' Senko type baits are workin' the best.

The bass fishin' on the Butler Chain is good real early and then it slows down durin' the day. Watch for schoolers comin' up to feed on the bait fish durin' the day. You need to fish the submerged hydrilla and pepper grass patches throughout the chain.

I'll be gone for a couple of weeks on vacation. So I'll see ya at the end of the month when I get back.

We have a full moon this Saturday, so the fishin' should improve durin' that time.

the judges deliberate, the coaches will take questions from a live audience, according to a press release.

Williams said the Crying Towel tradition originally started in the 1960s or 1970s, when Orange County had only eight to 10 high schools. The Rotary Club would host the event as a luncheon. As more high schools arrived in Orange County, though, the tradition eventually disappeared.

Williams credits the invitational's namesake, Dave Powers, for revitalizing the tradition in 2014. Powers served as the primary sponsor of "Talkin' Old School with Roger Franklin Williams" and contributed financially to the athletic program at Bishop Moore Catholic High School, his alma mater. Powers died on Nov. 7, 2017, after presiding over United Legacy Bank and other community banks.

The rejuvenated event's format differs from the original. Instead of presenting all Orange County high schools, the invitational features only four coaches. It also includes a social hour and prix fixe dinner instead of a luncheon. Christner's Prime Steak and Lobster has hosted the Crying Towel Invitational dinner and pre-

tangs' season, other than a 53-6 win over Eustis. Wekiva finished the 2024 season with a 3–7 record, ranked 197th in the state, scoring 202 points and allowing 311.

Last year's win over Olympia was more about Olympia than about Wekiva, though. While the Mustangs outplayed Olympia, it was the Titans' own mistakes that ultimately cost them the game. Olympia fumbled the ball six times due to high snaps, and Wekiva's defense was responsible for the first nine points of the

However, Olympia's mistakes could be attributed mainly to a tumultuous 2024 offseason, much like Apopka's 2025 offseason. The school lost 36 seniors and 21 starters from the previous season, yet still finished the 2024 season with a 4–6 record.

Interestingly, Wekiva has been in a similar situation. Last year, head coach Doug Gabriel said team replaced nearly 75 percent of the 2023 roster. During this year's spring game loss to Lyman High School, Gabriel said he is still dealing with a lot of inexperienced kids, as many of his starters graduated last

"All of our players have grad-

uated, so we're very young," Gabriel said. "I was happy with the performance, but we have a lot to learn because they still don't know the plays."

In last year's matchup, Wekiva put up 275 yards to Olympia's 114. Of those yards, 165, and a passing touchdown, came through the air from the Mustangs quarterback Jackson Keillor.

Unfortunately for the Mustangs, Keillor was in his senior season. Now, the Mustangs face a similar challenge to Apopka as they try to figure out who in their quarterback group is ready to take charge.

When we have to pull girls that played on varsity last year and move them down, yeah, it's tough, but if it's what it takes, then so be it. I wanted them to be the foundation."

Egbers and Mater said they will be pushing the teams harder this year.

"Back when I was racing cars and winning, I didn't win on Saturday night," Ma-

ter said. "I won in the garage Sunday morning, when we were tearing the car apart. So, we have to work out in the gym and do cardio. We have to do all of it."

The girls volleyball season starts with two preseason games for the varsity team only. On Tuesday, Apopka will travel to Edgewater High School to face Cypress Creek. On Thursday, Apopka will travel to Edgewater again to face Boone.

The regular season starts on Aug.18, with the Blue Darters hosting the University High School Cougars.



Stew things up with okra soup, easy bread, slaw, and dump cake

Emily Meggett's Okra Soup calls for an optional half-pound of small shrimp, and she serves it over white rice. This recipe calls for Nature's Seasons,



which is a Morton's blend of onion, garlic, salt, pepper and other spices. It is MSG-free, and it is Kosher. She adds a little sugar which is supposed to balance the acidity and enhance flavor. (I don't do it! Shame on me. And I use chunks of beef instead of shrimp.) Although it is called "soup," it is not "soup" in the traditional sense of the word. When you serve it over rice, it is more like a stew. From the picture in the book, it looks rich and full of vegetables and shrimp. It looks wonderful, and I want some!

Susie Sams' Mexican Black Bean Salad, is one of the recipes we have from a Taste of Heaven, from our friends over at First Presbyterian Church of Punta Gorda.

Easy Bread is a recipe that Bonnie Milliken shares in Northside Baptist Church's cookbook. It calls for any beverage on which you care to base your bread.

From New Vision's Feeding the Flock, there is cabbage slaw with crunchy Ramen noodles and browned sesame seeds and almonds, topped with a whip-up yourself dressing. We can thank Pat Jania for this delicious slaw. This reminds me a little of the cole slaw my daddy made: he crushed peanuts and added them into the cole slaw. That was so good!

Fresh Garden Relish from the Progressive Farmer's SOUTHERN Cookbook is superb over turnip greens and blackeyed peas. I can see it on my table for any occasion because it is made from wonderfully fresh vegetables.

Shirley Keck, the wonderful wife of our fishing expert, Jim Keck, who writes the weekly article, Goin' Fishin', treats us to her Dump Cake. This is very simple, and it is delicious, too! We know because she brought this dessert to one of our celebrations here at The Apopka Chief. (And we held her cake-taker hostage until she promised us the recipe! It follows below. Ha ha ha!)

EMILY MEGGETT'S OKRA SOUP

Recipe from Gullah Geechee Home

Cooking by Emily Meggett 1/4 pound salt pork, cut into about ten cheese one-inch long chunks

4 pounds okra, cut into 1/2-inch long 2 (15-ounce) cans black beans, drained

Or ... 2-1/2 pounds frozen cut okra 1 onion, chopped

1 bell pepper, chopped

4 cups tepid water

1 tablespoon Nature's Seasons, plus more to taste

1 6-ounce can tomato paste Seasoning salt, to taste

1 tablespoon sugar

1/2 pound small shrimp, peeled and deveined (optional)

2 tablespoons unsalted butter, if using shrimp Saltine crackers, to serve

Cooked long-grain white rice, to serve

1) In a large, heavy-bottomed pot, fry 2 or 3 pieces of salt pork. Cook over mediumhigh heat for about 5 minutes, until browned and crisp. 2) In the same pot, add the remaining salt pork, the okra, onion, and bell pepper and sauté over medium heat in the salt pork for 12 to 15 minutes. 3) Add the water and Nature's Seasons and let it come to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium and let the mixture cook slowly for 1-1/2 hours. 4) After 1-1/2 hours, add the tomato paste, seasoning salt, and sugar and turn down the heat to low. Rinse out the tomato paste can and add 1 canful of water to the pot. Cook over low heat for 15 to 20 minutes. (If you don't turn the heat to a low temperature and give it time to slowly simmer, it will burn.) 5) If you want to add shrimp, saute the desired amount in the butter in a separate skillet until pink and add it to the okra soup just before serving; don't overcook the shrimp. 6) Serve

SUSIE SAMS' MEXICAN **BLACK BEAN SALAD**

Recipe from A Taste of Heaven First Presbyterian Church, Punta Gorda 1 (8-ounce) carton sour cream

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro 1 tablespoon taco seasoning

1 large head green leaf lettuce, torn 4 tablespoons sugar

(about 10 cups) 2 cups (8-ounces) shredded cheddar

1/2 cup chopped purple onion

2 large tomatoes, chopped

Corn chips, crushed Combine sour cream, cilantro, and taco seasoning in a large bowl, stirring well. Add lettuce, then cheese, onion, black beans, and chopped tomatoes. Toss well. Sprinkle with crushed corn chips and serve immediately. Yield: 6 servings.

BONNIE MILLIKEN'S EASY BREAD Recipe from Northside Baptist Church's cookbook

1 package yeast

1/2 teaspoon salt

1-1/2 cups any beverage 3-plus cups flour

1 tablespoon honey, depending on how sweet the beverage

1 tablespoon oil

Enough oil to coat inside of bowl

Mix all ingredients. Knead on slightly floured surface, using enough extra flour to make not sticky. Allow dough to rise in oiled bowl. Punch down. Put into greased bread baking pan. Raise until bread reaches the top of pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Yield: 1 loaf

PAT JANIA'S CABBAGE **CRUNCH SLAW**

Recipe from New Vision Community Church's Feeding the Flock

4 tablespoons sesame seeds 1 cup slivered almonds

1 head cabbage, grated

4 green onions, sliced

2 packages chicken Ramen noodles, dry, without seasoning packets

In pan without oil, brown sesame seeds and almonds. Be careful not to burn. Toss salad ingredients together, add browned sesame seeds and almonds.

Dressing: 1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon pepper

6 tablespoons vinegar

1 package chicken flavor Ramen noodles

seasoning mix Mix dressing ingredients together and pour over salad. Toss well. Serve.

FRESH GARDEN RELISH **ON TURNIP GREENS**

Recipe from The Progressive Farmer's SOUTHERN Cookbook

3 tomatoes, diced

1 cup chopped celery

1 medium cucumber, peeled, sliced, and finely chopped 3 tablespoons finely chopped onion

1 medium-sized green pepper, chopped Salt and black pepper to taste

2 tablespoons French dressing

2 tablespoons vinegar Mix and chill.
