Mustangs down Warriors in defensive battle, 12-9

In a low-scoring, defensive-oriented contest, the Wekiva Mustangs' offense moved the ball just enough to even the overall record at 2-2. Having to travel the much more difficult road to the playoffs was prevented with the 12-9 victory over the West Orange Warriors.

"Even with the challenging schedule, a team needs to have at least a .500 record just to be in contention for the playoffs" Wekiva head coach Schwartz said. "Such was the case last season for us. We would have to win four of six contests just to reach .500 if the record was now 1-3. Winning five of six contests would have been most likely and with the Edgewater Eagles and Jones Tigers still on the schedule.

"Not impossible and nobody wants to play badly for even a couple of minutes. However, attempting to produce positive results while under the pressure of missing the playoffs because of two bad plays is a difficult situation in which to perform. Then there is the atmosphere during practices. The goal is to improve with each contest. We are practicing with the situation including the odds of earning a playoff berth which is less likely if the Warriors win, though."

A much more consistent performance

was produced by the Wekiva defense.

Look no further than total amount of points given up. Against the Lake Minneola Hawks on Friday, September 8, the defense gave up 34 points. Six plays out of 63 facilitated the 34 points as at least 20 yards were gained by Lake Minneola. The yards gained on those six plays by the Hawks also accounted for 170 of the total 353 gained.

Against West Orange, Wekiva gave up three plays of at least 20 yards. The ball was further moved at least 15 yards during only five plays against the Warriors. Total yards gained were 331-258 in favor of Wekiva.

Possessions ending inside the Mustangs' 26-yard line without the Warriors scoring points most importantly totaled three.

"Inconsistency and in particular, the 170 yards gained on the six plays was emphasized throughout the week," Schwartz said. "I spoke about every player doing the job assigned. Cause is behind the surface and subtle. Seeing the results and damage is easy. Every play in which Lake Minneola moved the ball at least 20 yards, someone was in the wrong gap. Eliminate the number of plays in which a player runs to the wrong gap, eliminate the number of plays with big impact."

The return of quarterback Ty'Ray Da-

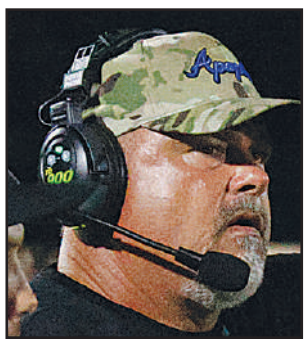

as well as in PEP column.

Although the Blue Darters had scheduled a light week for practice during the open date, it was lighter than expected due to heat bulb and lightning restrictions. "We went three days and didn't get them all in," Apopka coach Jeff Rolson said.

Nonetheless, the schedule marches on and the 3-0 Blue Darters will host the 4-0 Eagles in a battle of Central Florida powerhouses.

Like Apopka, the Eagles lost some outstanding players off the 2022 team, but none bigger than running back Cedric Baxter, who now plays for the Texas Longhorns. However, the Eagles are still solid on both sides of the ball.

"They've got a good quarterback and they've got some guys who can catch it. They can go with a wildcat quarterback and can function," Rolson said. "They've still got good players and they can throw it a little bit, which helps them. I think

"They run a lot of formations. A lot of shifts and movements. They've got dynamic players in spots

Mustangs host Patriots in non-district game

When taking to the field today, Friday, September 22, the Wekiva Mustangs will face the most unconventional challenge of the season in the form of the Lake Brantley Patriots. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. at Baptiste Orthodontics Stadium, Wekiva's home facility.

Patience and discipline always top the list of essen-

tials required to win in any sport. However, the Patriots have made a living by taking advantage of opponents lacking patience and discipline more so than others through using the triple option offense.

"How to defeat the Patriots is far easier to explain than actually execute," Mustangs coach Jeremiah Schwartz said. "The defense must play

As the weather cools, specks will start bitin'

Hello Folks,

It's gettin' a little cooler. It's not cool enough for me, but it's not in the high 90s when you go outside. I can hardly wait for some cooler weather and some good fishin' this fall.

I talked to Kyle at Bitter's Bait and Tackle earlier this week and he reports that the shop is a little slow right now. There are just a handful of people fishin' for bluegills, but that season is just about over here in Central Florida. It will soon be time to start catchin' some specks.

Kyle reports that the specks were really bitin' about a week ago, but all of a sudden, they quit bitin' over the past few days. Most of the specks were bein' caught in Lake Monroe on minners. Folks were driftin' the deeper channels through the lake. Some folks are catchin' a few specks in Lake Jesup under the State Road 417 bridge. You need a bucket of minners, a cane pole, some floats, and a small split shot, along with a number 2 or 4 size hook. The ole timers told me to always use a gold hook. Ever since I started fishin' for specks, that's all I have ever used. I'm sure other hooks work as well, but for me, that's what I use to catch 'em.

The bass fishin has been good most days, but most of the folks will tell you, you need to get on the water real early. Some folks are gettin' on the water before sunrise. Well, if that's your thing, go for it. I like gettin' on the water early as well, but that's a little too early for me. Kyle has been fishin' the Harris Chain for the past two weeks and has some good days on the water. There have been a few days that it's been kinda slow, but overall, it's been pretty good. Most of the bass are bitin' on chatter-baits, plastic worms, and swimjigs. You can catch a few bass early in the mornin' on top-water baits as well.

Kyle also mentioned that the water temperature has come down quite a bit, about 10 degrees since summer. That's really good news, since it's been so hot this summer. The bass fishin' on West Lake has been good if you are fishin' with shiners. You can catch a few bass on plastic worms, swimjigs around the shoreline cover. When the sun gets up, try flippin' the heavy cover with your favorite flippin' bait.

The bass fishin' on the Maitland Chain has been pretty good. Most of the bass are bein' caught around the submerged hydrilla and eel-grass throughout the chain. You can use lipless crank-baits, spinner-baits, and chatter-baits. If you can't get a bite on one of those baits, try fishin' the grass with slow-sinkin' Senko-type baits or your favorite plastic worm.

We are comin' up to the end of Trophy Bass Season 11. You must get your Trophy Catch bass into the FWC by September 30. Your bass must weigh at least 8 lbs. or larger in order to qualify for some awesome prizes.

You can visit the FWC website Trophy Bass for all the requirements for submitting your bass.

On September 29, we are goin' to have a full moon. The fishin' should really start to pick up, and, hopefully with a little cooler weather, those fish will start to bite. See ya next week.

Tip of the week: full moon.

Wekiva: Patriots still utilize triple option offense

assignment football, which requires 100 percent discipline and patience.

"Preparation in general is difficult. Simulating the entire triple option package with any consistency is almost impossible, because of the rarity."

Under the late George Clayton, longtime Lake Brantley coach, the Patriots rose to state prominence. Then during a tenure lasting almost three decades, Lake Brantley maintained the status while calling the triple option for about 80 percent of its plays. At the end of the 2015 season, Clayton retired, and his son, Skip was promoted during the following off-season to the Patriots' head man. Including last season, consistently qualifying for the playoffs has continued.

Wekiva is led by Jeremiah Schwartz for a third season.

The contest tonight is the 13th edition of a more subtle geographical rivalry because the schools are located in different counties. However, the distance between the schools is only five miles.

Last season, turnovers opened the door for the Patriots to record victory over the Mustangs by a 17-12 score last season. Wekiva committed five turnovers and all 17 of Lake Brantley's points were scored on subsequent possessions.

At least on the surface of the results and approach to attacking opponents, both teams are moving in different directions.

The Mustangs are 2-2, won last week, and are currently ranked 12th in the *Orlando Sentinel* Super 16. The schedule is perhaps the most challenging in Central Florida as all four opponents are ranked.

A physical, relentless rushing attack was the bread and butter of Wekiva football during the first two seasons of Schwartz's tenure as the head coach. Through the first four contests of the 2023 season, the physical, relentless character remains the focus when rushing. However, the Mustangs attempted 116 passes compared to 103 rushes through the first four contests.

The passing game is a work in progress as completion percentage is only 43. However, when passes are completed, an average of 15.75 yards have been gained.

Josh Bennett has been the go-to receiver for touchdowns, scoring all five. Against the West Orange Warriors last week, the lone passing touchdown end-

ed with Bennett in the end zone. A simple screen pass from Ty'Ray Davis into the left flat became an along the left sideline, 80-yard touchdown. Thirteen passes have been caught by Bennett totaling 357 yards and an average of 27.5.

Six other receivers have caught passes - Anthony Gay, Jeremy Benjamin, Jabari Smith, Jamarian Robinson, Tyree Filius, and Michael Ellis. The chains have kept moving due to Gay catching 11 passes.

Lake Brantley hasn't changed the approach to attacking the opponent and a 1-3 record is below the standard expected based on previous results.

The triple option forces defenses to worry about multiple running options on a single play.

"The triple-option is specifically designed to gain yardage through the creation of misdirection and counters," Schwartz said. "When the defense bites on the mis-directions and counters, the end result is the ball carrier runs into open space. The play turns into big impact with long yardage gained. The ball carrier getting into open space when rushing behind the line is because the defense was physically pushed backward.

"Success is realized through the triple option because the Patriots have used it for so long. Making and executing all the decisions is second nature. To the degree of opponents can't count on Lake Brantley committing mistakes which derail the misdirection and counters. When mistakes are almost non-existent and opponents' weaknesses are attacked precisely, the triple option is lethal."

Several very specific decisions of who eventually carries the ball as well as when are made by the quarterback. All decisions are also determined by location of the ball. However, there are three general phases during which the decisions are made.

The overall decision of whether the quarterback keeps the ball or hands off is determined by the defensive end's actions. When running straight up the field or directly at the quarterback, the ball is handed off to the fullback. Keeping the ball comes into play when the defensive end focuses on the fullback. The quarterback then faces the decision of handing off or keeping the ball for a third time. If a handoff is pursued during the third phase, the running back receives the ball.

Play-action is a constant complementary threat as well.

"Concept of how the triple option works sounds like plays of big impact are common," Schwartz said. "However, advantages as far as tactics and adjusting during the contest are based on ball control. When run properly, the ball is moved three, four yards at a time and methodically down the field. Set up third-down-and-short with three or four yards on first and second downs. One first down, another set of downs after another. Offense needs to execute only a couple of big plays to take the lead and eventually win. If the opponent doesn't have possession of the ball, scoring isn't possible. Ball control also means the defense stays on the field and can wear down.

"Disadvantage of the triple option is only one, but huge. Coming from behind is difficult because of the control the clock through three- and four-yard gains at a time concept. The less time remaining, the more the need to execute long gains on a single play and contradictory to the concept of the triple option."

Losses have been at the hands of the Oviedo Lions, Lyman Greyhounds, and Lake Mary Rams. The Patriots defeated the Naples Palmetto Ridge Bears 61-26. However, in general, inconsistency among the scores and 123-61 combined score has been the most obvious staple of the Patriots' season. Scores of individual contests were 60-47 against Oviedo, 28-12 against Lyman, and 35-2 against Lake Mary.

The quarterback is charged with making the decisions which trigger the proper execution of the triple option. Thus, a certain skill set and physical attributes are required for the quarterback to run the offense successfully. At 5-foot-9, junior Parker Perales has taken over the starting quarterback role. With the ability to also throw the ball deep, Perales is the latest quarterback possessing the physical attributes needed for successfully running the Lake Brantley version of the triple option.

Getting the most when completing pass attempts is also a part of Perales' game. Completing only 42 percent or 14-of-33 passes, but for an average of 14.75 yards per completion.

Sixty-five percent of the rushes have been handled by Perales or Tavin Hebert, respectively. The duo has gained 737 yards on the ground. However, highest average number for yards per carry of 9.4 (27-255) has been produced by Alexander Catano.

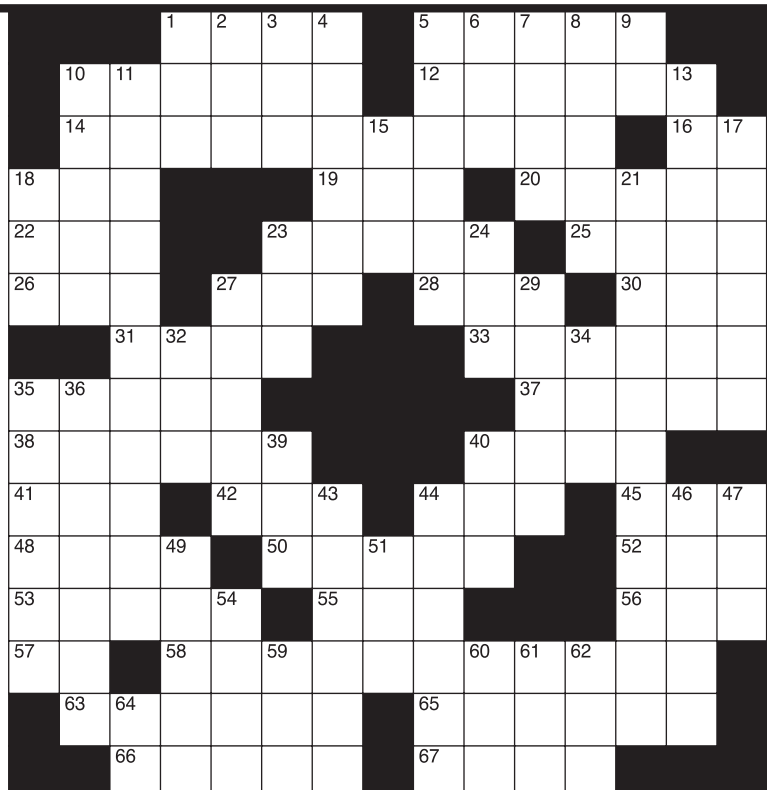

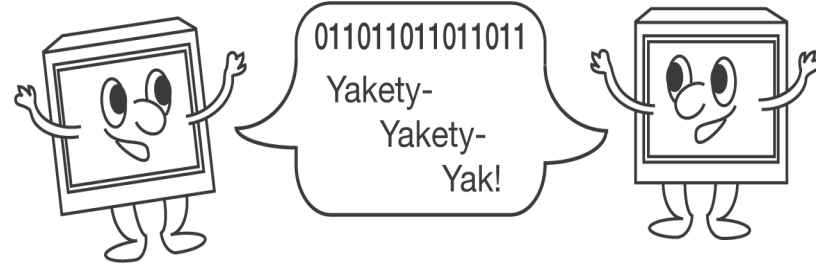
