### **Orange County Library System Turns 100**

On November 8, Orange County Library System celebrates its 100th birthday with a systemwide party at all branch locations.

Customers of all ages are invited to stop by during the library's open hours, fill out a birthday card and share a special library memory. Customers who visit that day will receive a free 100 Year Celebration logo cookie, while supplies

The Albertson Public Library first opened its doors on November 8, 1923. That library was made possible thanks to a massive book donation from retired New York City police inspector Captain Charles Albertson, who agreed to give his collection of books to the city of Orlando if it built a public library to house them. Ever since then, Orange County Library System has been

dedicated to meeting the needs of the community.

From the earliest introduction of mobile services like bookmobiles and home delivery, to the establishment of OCLS's current 15 locations (and counting), the work done over the past century has established Orange County Library System as a pillar of the community. Last year, over 3.3 million items were circulated and 2.6 million digital items were downloaded by library cardholders.

In 2023, the library held a reading challenge during the annual Summer at Your Library program, during which 3,496 participants logged a total of more than 2.1 million minutes read during the summer. Local Wanderer, OCLS's culture pass program, provided more than 5,000 customers free access to local arts and cultural attractions, including the Central Flori-

da Zoo and Botanical Gar- to bring mobile services dens, the Mennello Musethe Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts.

The library has also made strides toward eliminating barriers to service for example, fines for overdue materials were eliminated and a special library card for kids living in group homes was created.

Orange County Library System looks forward to a bright future. Two new branches are planned – one in Horizon West and one in Lake Nona - and the library's new Community Engagement Department is implementing programs and initiatives designed to take place where library customers need them, such as senior centers, hospitals and Head Starts.

Thanks to a generous \$100,000 donation from Sorosis of Orlando Woman's Club, the library plans

back to the community. So um of American Art, and far, the funding has enabled the library to purchase its first book bike, capable of visiting community events like pop-up markets and festivals to check out books and promote library services and card signups.

> Looking ahead, the library hopes to use the funds to re-introduce a bookmobile to Orange County and ensure that everybody has access to the resources, materials and experiences they need to enrich their lives.



A FOCUS ON SENIOR CITIZENS



### Federalist papers first appeared in New York City newspaper in 1787

1805 - The Battle of Trafalgar took place between the British Royal Navy and the combined French and Spanish fleets. The victorious British ended the threat of Napoleon's invasion of England. British naval hero Admiral Horatio Nelson was mortally wounded aboard his ship Victory.

1879 - Thomas Edison successfully tested an electric incandescent lamp with a carbonized filament at his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey, keeping it lit for over 13 hours.

**1915** - The first transatlantic radio voice message was made by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company from Virginia to Paris.

1944 - During World War II in Europe, American troops captured Aachen in western Germany after a week of hard fighting. It was the first large German city taken by the Allies.

1967 - Thousands of anti-war protesters stormed the Pentagon during a rally against the Vietnam War in Washington, D.C. About 250 were arrested. No shots were fired, but demonstrators were struck with nightsticks and rifle butts.

**Birthday** - Jazz great Dizzy Gillespie (1917-1993) was born in Cheraw, South Carolina (as John Birks Gillespie). He was a trumpet player, composer, band leader and one of the founding fathers of modern jazz, known for his trademark puffed cheeks and bent trumpet.

October 22

Kennedy appeared on television to inform Americans of the existence of Russian missiles in Cuba. The President demanded their removal and announced a naval "quarantine" of Cuba. Six days later, the Russians announced they would remove the weapons. In return, the U.S. later removed missiles from Turkey.

1979 - The exiled Shah of Iran arrived in the United States for medical treatment. A few weeks later, Iranian militants seized the U.S. Embassy in Tehran and took 66 Americans hostage. They demanded the return of the Shah for trial. The U.S. refused. The Shah died of cancer in July of 1980. The hostages were freed in January of 1981.

Birthday - Hungarian composer Franz Liszt (1811-1886) was born in Raiding, Hungary. He was a brilliant pianist best known for Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2, Liebestraum No. 3, and his Faust and Dante symphonies.

#### October 23

1942 - British General Bernard Montgomery launched a major offensive against German forces under Erwin Rommel at El Alamein, Egypt.

1956 - A Hungarian uprising against Communist rule began with students and workers demonstrating in Budapest. Soviet Russians responded by sending in tanks and put down the revolt after several days of bitter fighting.

1983 - Terrorists drove a truck loaded with TNT into the U.S. and French head-1962 - President John F. quarters in Beirut, Lebanon, exploding it and killing 241 U.S. Marines and 58 French paratroopers.

1989 - Hungary declared itself a republic 33 years after Soviet Russian troops crushed a popular revolt against Communist rule.

1990 - Ukrainian Prime Minister Vitaly Masol resigned after mass protests by students, becoming the first Soviet official of that rank to quit under public pressure.

#### October 24

**1861** - The first transcontinental telegram in America was sent from San Francisco to Washington, addressed to President Abraham Lincoln from the Chief Justice of California. 1922 - The Irish Parliament voted to adopt a constitution for an Irish Free State, which formally came into existence in December.

1929 - "Black Thursday" occurred in the New York Stock Exchange as nearly 13 million shares were sold in panic selling. Five days later "Black Tuesday" saw 16 million shares sold.

1931 - Chicago gangster "Scarface" Al Capone was sentenced to 11 years in jail for Federal income tax evasion. In 1934, he was transferred to Alcatraz prison near San Francisco. He was paroled in 1939, suffering from syphilis. He retired to his mansion in Miami Beach where he died in 1947.

#### 1945 - The United Nations was founded.

1980 - Communist authorities in Poland granted recognition to the trade union "Solidarity." It was subsequently outlawed in 1981 after the government imposed martial law. In 1989, it was re-legalized.

1994 - For the first time in 25 years, British troops were absent from the streets of Londonderry, Northern Ireland, following ceasefires by Irish Republican Army (IRA) and pro-British forces.

#### Octobr 25

1854 - During the Crimean War, the Charge of the Light Brigade occurred as Lord Cardigan led the British cavalry against the Russians at Balaclava. Of 673 British cavalrymen taking part in the charge, 272 were killed. The Charge was later immortalized in the poem by Alfred Lord Tennyson.

1955 - Austria reassumed its sovereignty with the departure of the last Allied forces. The country had been occupied by the Nazis from 1938-45. After World War II, it was divided into four occupation zones by the U.S., Russia, Britain and France.

**25-30, 1983** - The Caribbean island of Grenada was invaded by the U.S. to restore "order and democracy." Over 2,000 Marines and Army Rangers seized control after a political coup the previous week had made the island a "Soviet-Cuban colony," according to President Ronald Rea-

Birthday - Artist Pablo Picasso (1881-1973) was born in Malaga, Spain. He was an experimental painter and also became a fine sculptor, engraver and ceramist.

October 26

**1881** - The shoot-out at in 2008. the O.K. Corral in Tombstone, Arizona, occurred between the feuding Clanton and Earp families. Wyatt Earp, two of his brothers and "Doc" Holliday gunned down two Clantons

and two others.

1825 - The Erie Canal opened as the first major man-made waterway in America, linking Lake Erie with the Hudson River, bypassing the British-controlled lower St. Lawrence. The canal cost over \$7 million and took eight years to complete.

1951 - Winston Churchill became Britain's prime minister for a second time, following his Conservative Party's narrow victory in general elections. In his first term from 1940-45 he had guided Britain through its struggle against Nazi Germany.

1955 - Ngo Dinh Diem proclaimed South Vietnam a republic and declared himself president.

Birthday - Hillary Rodham Clinton was born in Park Ridge, Illinois, October 26, 1947. She was First Lady from 1993-2001 during the presidency of her husband Bill Clinton. In 2000, she became the only First Lady ever elected to the U.S. Senate, serving as a Democrat from New York. She was re-elected in 2006 and then began a presidential campaign, hoping to become America's first female president. She lost the Democratic nomination to Barack Obama who went on to win the general election and appointed her as U.S. Secretary of State

October 27

1787 - The first of 85 Federalist Papers appeared in print in a New York City newspaper. The essays argued for the adoption of the new U.S. Constitution. They were written by Alexander Hamilton, James Madison and John Jay.

1904 - The New York City subway began operating, running from City Hall to West 145th Street, the first underground and underwater rail system in the world. 1978 - The Nobel Peace Prize was awarded jointly to Menachem Begin of Israel and Anwar Sadat of Egypt.

Birthdays - British navigator James Cook (1728-1779) was born in Yorkshire, England. He explored New Zealand, Australia, and the Hawaiian Is-

- Theodore Roosevelt (1858-1919) the 26th U.S. President was born in New York City. He succeeded to the presidency following the assassination of President William McKinley. Roosevelt served from September 14, 1901 to March 3, 1909. Best remembered for stating, "Speak softly and carry a big stick."

- Welsh poet and playwright Dylan Thomas (1914-1953) was born in Swansea, Wales. His works included; The World I Breathe, Portrait of the Artist as a Young Dog, The Doctor and the Devil and the drama Under Milk







### Chicken and rice could be called Chicken Perloo in the lowcountry

gett has a recipe for Chicken Perloo. She says, "Many of the one-pot rice dishes in the Lowcountry and the South can



trace their origins back to west Africa. There's jollof rice in West Africa, jambalaya in Louisiana, and here in the Lowcountry? We've got red rice and chicken perloo. Chicken perloo has a lot of the same European and African cooking styles you find in dishes like Spanish paella and Ghanaian jollof rice. However, tender chicken, broth, and perfectly fluffed rice make this a true Lowcountry dish.'

New Orleans Barbecue Shrimp comes to us from Southern Living's 2009 All-Time Favorites.

Here is a recipe for Marvin Woods' macaroni salad. This recipe makes 6 servings, enough for most family meals. He says, "Most macaroni is tube-shaped, but there are other forms including shells, twists, and ribbons. Elbows are, of course, the favorite. Beware, most macaroni doubles in size during cooking.

Marv says, "This is one of the celebrated salads of the South. Whether it is an indoor or an outdoor function, you will usually see a few different versions of this salad. I also like to add flaked crabmeat or fresh tuna to this basic recipe. Other ingredients to think about using are ham, boiled eggs, sausage, and tomatoes.

Marvin Woods says, regarding his Marv Spice (Savory), "I use this spice mixture in my Macaroni and Cheese as well as in fish, chicken, and meat dishes that I feel can use a touch of inspiration.'

We found a wonderful peach cobbler recipe in Hearty Country Cooking, from Mark Sohn. You can find peaches in most of the markets.

Mark says, "From the Alleghenies to the Smokies and from the Blue Ridge west to the Highland Rim, this shortcake-style or biscuit-type cobbler is a favorite.

From Charleston Receipts, which is America's oldest Junior League Cook in print (1950), we have Huckleberry Pie from Mrs. Thomas Legare, Jr. You may use premade pie crust if you like.

From there, Majority Leader Steve Scalise won the nomination but quickly backed out after failing to get the needed support. House Judiciary Chair Rep. Jim Jordan, R-Ohio, was next in line but lost the nomination af-

Jordan took fire in particular for questioning the results of the 2020 election, which has become a key issue in this speakership bat-

Majority Whip Tom Emmer, R-Minn., was next to secure the nomination but quickly withdrew after failing to gain support. Notably, former President Donald Trump aggressively spoke out against Emmer, likely hurting his chances.

However, Trump's endorsement of Jordan was not enough to secure the speakership.

Now, the House re-

mains stalled and unable to pass any legislation until resolving the lack of a speaker. The federal government is set to partially shut down in the middle of November if another spending package is not passed, and lawmakers face growing calls to send funds overseas to help Ukraine and Israel with their respec-

"Mike Johnson is a man of integrity and a principled conservative," Rep. Jim Banks, R-Ind., wrote on X, formerly known as Twitter. "I will be proud to cast my vote on behalf of northeast Indiana for him on the floor tomorrow to make him the next Speaker of the House!"


