APK girls soccer falls to Oviedo

The Apopka girls soccer team plays their final game of the regular season on Friday, January 17. The girls had a roller coaster of a season and sit with an 8-8-1 record. They are fourth in 7A District 3 with a 2-1-1 district record, and as of Wednesday, January 15, are ranked 156th in Florida and 667th in the nation.

The start of the season was rough for the girls, winning just one match in their first five games and being outscored 19-6 in those five matches. But the girls quickly turned it around. The next five games the girls went 3-2 making an immediate im-

provement and only being outscored by one goal (15-14) from their opponents in this five-game stretch.

In the last seven games, which brings us to Tuesday, January 14th, the girls have performed the best they have all season going 4-2-1. In that seven-game stretch, the girls also matched their opponents scoring 13 goals and allowing 13 goals.

The Apopka girls soccer team had a strength of schedule of 8.59 this season according to FHSAA. That strength of schedule rivals some of the top 50 and even top 20 teams in the state. Apopka's average opponent rank this season was 173.55 with eight opponents ranked in the top 100 of the state (Hagerty

#56, Lake Brantley #84, Oviedo #62, West Orange #52, Timber Creek #9, New Smyrna #76, Bishop Moore #29, and Winter Park #49).

The girl's team has not entered stats since the beginning of December, so I can't go into detail about the team's leaders.

This week the girls had three games. On Monday, January 13, they hosted Eustis and defeated them 4-0, on Tuesday, January 14, they hosted Oviedo and fell 7-1. On Friday, January 17, they face Winter Springs in their final game of the regular season.

Winter Springs as of Wednesday, January 15, is 5-10 this season, 0-3 in

Apopka's win streak comes to an end, a look at the postseason

The Apopka boys basketball team's win streak came to an end at nine after falling to the number four ranked team in the state, Windermere, in the Metro Conference tournament. Right after their loss to Windermere, Apopka faced another elite program in Edgewater who is ranked 33rd in the state, and fell. The boys are now 14-5 on the season, 2-0 in district matchups, and are ranked 49th in the state according to FHSAA as of Wednesday, January 15.

While the boy's win streak did end, it was ended by a top-five team in the state. Windermere is 16-3 with their only losses being to #41 ranked Lake High-

land (50-46), #10 ranked Villages Charter (77-74), and #5 ranked Gibbs (65-63). Head coach of the Apopka Blue Darters boys basketball team, Scott Williams, told me last week before the game that he thought Windermere is one of the most complete offensive teams in the state this year.

But the Metro Conference tournament wasn't done yet as Apopka still had one more game to play. The loss to Edgewater was a closer game, but Apopka's slow start in the first half created a second half full of hurdles for them to jump.

After the tournament last week Apopka got back to work this week and traveled to Lake Minneola to face the Hawks. Apopka defeated the Hawks 49-34 on Tuesday, January 14.


"Its definitely been a roller coaster. We start-

Ashford had an incredible freshman season collecting a slew of accolades and cementing himself as a huge piece of his team's offensive line.

The specks are still biting when the wind isn't too bad

Hello Folks,

We are off and runnin' into the New Year. It's hard to believe we are already halfway through the first month of 2025. We are havin' some cool to real cold weather and that has affected some of the fishin' in our waters.

The specks are still bitin' if the wind isn't blowin' very hard. If you get a chance to go catch some specks in Lake Monroe, please make sure it's safe. Folks are catchin' specks in open water on minners and a few specks are bein' caught on jigs tipped with a minner. If you want to

try catchin' a few specks on jigs, make sure you use a bright colored jig. The wind has gotten the water all stirred up and the specks will see that bright colored jig pretty quickly.

The specks are still bitin' under the 417 bridge in Lake Jesup. Most of those

specks are bein' caught on minners. Folks are catchin' some specks in Lake Kissimmee around the pads scattered throughout the lake. Most of those specks are bein' caught on minners.

As far as the bass fishin' goes, it depends on where you go fishin'. Folks are catchin' some nice bass on shiners, and in some places, they are catchin' 30 to 40 bass per trip. I see a lot of bass bein' caught at the Headwaters in Palm Bay. Folks are catchin' some big bass on shiners in the Kissimmee Chain as well. It's that time of

the year when shiners will give you the best shot at catchin' a big bass.

Also, the bass fishin' in the Butler Chain and the Maitland Chain has been really good. Some folks are free-linin' shiners out the back of the boat over the submerged hydrilla and eel-grass beds throughout these chains. You can catch a few bass on artificials as well. Try fishin' top water early in the mornin' and then try fishin' a chatter-bait around in those same types of area.

The bass fishin' in one of the lakes in our area isn't goin' as well as oth-

ers. My buddy Rich Niles fished his club's tournament on East Lake this past weekend. Rich reports that the fishin' was tough. A five-fish limit per angler is this club's rules at each tournament. This past weekend it took a little over four pounds to win their tournament on East Lake. Folks, that makes for a long day on the water.

Congrats to all the anglers that endured a tough day on the water. If you fish long enough, you are goin' to have a few of those days when you are on the water. I have had a few of those days myself.

When I go fishin', I always want to catch lots of bass, includin' a bass over eight pounds. I always set my sights high, but some days things don't go my way. I guess that's why they call it fishin' and not catchin'.

I do hope you get a chance to do some fishin' this week, or over the weekend. See you next week.

highest-rated offenses in the state. In turn, Windermere turned those 24 turnovers into 27 points. Almost 40 percent (39.70) of Windermere's points came from Apopka's turnovers.

"Some of that is to their credit, but some of it is us playing a little bit rushed. It is something we're continuing to work on to not allow the defense, or the tempo of the de-

fense, to affect the tempo of the offense. And that's a challenging thing to do, but yeah, if you look at the statistics, both teams across the board, that was the one area that there was a clear difference. It made a big difference in the game," said Scott Williams.

Apopka was ahead at the beginning of this game coming out hot holding a 12-9 lead over Windermere near the end of the first quarter. But the Blue

Darters' offense stalled and the defense gave way to let Windermere take back the lead before the end of the quarter 16-12.

The game just got away from the Blue Darters after that as Windermere outscored them in the second and third quarters 19-12 and 18-9. Going into the fourth quarter Apopka was down 53-33. Apopka put their best quarter together in the fourth outscoring Windermere 16-15 but that was not enough to pull away with a win as they lost 68-49.

Apopka had a great game really except for a few weak points in their game. Those weak points were turnovers and paint defense. Moving on from turnovers Apopka allowed Windermere to score 38 points in the paint. Thirty-eight of Windermere's 68 points, or 55.88 percent of Windermere's points came

from inside the restricted area.

Windermere does have a monster of an athlete at power forward though that was responsible for most of these points in the paint. Terrance Drain is 6'7" and 218 pounds and is committed to playing for Liberty University which is a Division One school. Drain collected 21 points with all of them coming inside of the paint or at the free-throw line.

"They're just really, really difficult to play against. They pose a lot of problems to everybody, which is why, you know, they're currently, I think, fourth in all the state of Florida. That's because they have size at every position. They have a big man who is skilled and talented, but not only that, they use him effectively, and they have a lot of weapons offensively

around him.

And then, most importantly, they're really, really sound defensively. And so all those things being said, we competed great and did a lot of good things. I don't think I had a good plan in place for how we wanted to defend. TJ, over the course of 32 minutes," said Scott Williams.

Some more places where Apopka could have done better to get themselves into the game were rebounding and the number of shots they took. Apopka usually is a very strong rebounding team, especially on the offensive glass and this gives us more opportunities for second-chance points or points after an offensive rebound. Apopka collected 26 rebounds to Windermere's 29 with 22 of those rebounds coming on the defensive end. Windermere had 13 offensive rebounds to Apopka's

four and scored 13 second-chance points to Apopka's three.

Apopka also shot a lot less than Windermere, shooting 36 shots to Windermere's 59, but this is most likely due to the high amount of turnovers that took away shots from Apopka and gave them to Windermere.

I think this game showed that, in order to play with the best teams in the state, Apopka needs to master the basics. Ball security, rebounding, and interior defense will be key in beating any of the top-ranked teams in the state when it comes to playoff time because each team at that level might have one or two division-one guys that we will have to compete against.

Metro Conference Tournament (45-38) Loss

Coach Williams told me that he was very disappointed in the play of the team against Edgewater stating that they should've won that game. He credited the Apopka defense with holding Edgewater to just 45 points but was very unhappy with the offense's production in the first half.

"Yeah, we were terrible. I mean, it's Edgewater; they are really talented. They have a lot of dudes that can really attack you offensively. So, they're constantly putting stress on your defense. And we did really well, and I think we gave up 25 in the first half and 45 for the game, and did a really good job.

Unfortunately, our preparation to play, our focus, our energy, and our ability to trust and play with each other at the offensive end of the floor was nonexistent. And that was a game that nobody could tell me otherwise, I feel like once we played it, we should have won."

Apopka once again fell behind early in this

game being outscored in the first two quarters 12-8 and 13-6. Going into the third quarter Apopka was behind 25-14. But the second half is where the Blue Darters shined as the offense started finding their rhythm and the defense began to stall the Edgewater offense.

Apopka outscored Edgewater 14-12 in the third quarter and were going into the fourth, down 37-28. Apopka needed to turn up the heat and keep Edgewater cold.

They did just that and outscored Edgewater 10-6, but it wasn't enough to pull away with the win. Apopka fell to the Edgewater Eagles 43-38 in a tough game.

The Blue Darters and the Eagles played a very similar game with Edgewater averaging .75 points per possession and Apopka averaging .65 points per possession. Apopka shot slightly better than Edgewater with a team shooting percentage of 35.6 percent compared to Edgewater's 34.8 percent.

A point of growth for Apopka in this game was the turnovers and how they

controlled those losses. Apopka gave up 17 turnovers to Edgewater's 16 but only allowed Edgewater to score two points off 17 turnovers while Apopka scored 12 points off of Edgewater's 16 turnovers.

This is a game where Apopka should've and could've won but a slow start plagued them with playing behind and trying to catch up. If Apopka's offense can stay consistent and not start slow or drop off after the half, they can compete with the best teams in Florida. But scoring 14 points in the first half is a huge detriment that can't happen in the postseason.

In the final minutes of the game, Apopka had a chance to take the lead but more mistakes led to turnovers that stole that chance out of their hands.

"And then here we are with two minutes left in a one-point game. And then we proceed to pee down our pants and throw the ball away twice against the casual 1-3-1 zone, which was kind of indicative of our lack of focus for 32 minutes. As I told our guys after the game, I told them

two things, 'The basketball gods were just,' and, 'We got what we deserved.' And it is a loss that will haunt us when we're talking about playoff seedings and stuff at the end of the year."

Apopka's leaders in this game were: Jermichael Johnson, Jude Angervil, and Jahi Bowden. Johnson collected 14 points shooting 46.2 percent from the field while tallying six rebounds, three assists, four steals, two deflections, and one block. Angervil collected 10 points on 30.8 percent shooting while tallying three rebounds, one assist, one steal, and three blocks. Bowden collected nine points on 36.4 percent shooting while tallying six rebounds, two assists, two steals, and two deflections.

End of the regular season and the District Tournament

The boys have just five games left in the regular season. They were supposed to face Lake Buena Vista this week but the game was canceled at the request of Lake Buena Vista. The next five games for Apopka look like: Haines

City at Apopka on Saturday, January 18 slated for a 6 p.m. tipoff; University at Apopka on Wednesday, January 22, slated for a 7:30 tipoff; Apopka at Windermere on Thursday, January 24, slated for a 7 p.m. tipoff; Olympia at Apopka on Monday, January 27, slated for a 7:30 p.m. tipoff; and finally Apopka at Bartow for the Mosaic Shootout on Friday, January 31, slated for 7:30 p.m. tipoff.

Coach Williams told me that the next two weeks are going to be tough as four of their five opponents are ranked in the top 125 programs in the state. When talking about preparing for the upcoming games, Williams stressed that the rematch over Windermere is not their main focus. Instead, their main focus will be beating University as they belong to the same district and it means more for seeding.

When talking about the District Tournament, coach Williams is almost certain that Apopka will be the one seed. Williams also told me the importance of winning the District as Apopka has been a

perennial playoff team but has not won a district since 2018.

Coach Williams left me with this, "It'd be a tremendous opportunity, a tremendous challenge. It's something that we really want to try to do: be able to be good enough that first week of February to win two games and win a district. And with that comes a lot of benefits. You know, with that comes home playoff games, and with that comes increased seeding possibilities. But it's about taking where you are and hopefully playing your best basketball. You know if we're playing on February 7, can we play our best basketball game of the season? Will we be loose and free and poised and aggressive and attack-oriented, but also patient? We need to have all those things going and just go out there and play the kind of game we all can be proud of. And if that happens, I think we'll have a lot of success."

ed not being as successful as we planned, but I always tell the guys to trust the work. If you put in the work, the results will take care of themselves. Those words began to be void after a while as the boys kept working hard but didn't see much results. Let's look at the loss to Evans. Wekiva lost by one point to the number eight-ranked team in the state. That is huge. A win over Evans could've pushed Wekiva into the top 150 or even better. This game and the close losses shown since coming back from winter break are a good sign for Wekiva

who has five games left to play before the end of the season after this week's matches.

We have guys that can score the ball, but we can't neglect the defensive side of the ball.' So that run that we went on to start the third quarter - it started on the defensive end and not the offensive end."

The Mustangs came into the third quarter down a possession and were going into the fourth quarter

Cake recipe is easy to make with boxed cake mix and canned icing

Found in her cookbook, *Gullah Geechee Home Cooking*, Mrs. Emily Meggett has a recipe for Pork Loin Roast that will serve 8 to 10 people. She said, "This pork loin roast creates its own gravy during the cooking process. The Kitchen Bouquet adds a bit more seasoning and gives color to the gravy, making it a deeper brown after it's done cooking."



Field to Feast has recipes from all over our peerless state of Florida. This one for Minorcan Black Beans comes from "Old St. Augustine." In 2004, Craig and Barbie Raynor took over the reins of the company of the late Jerry Millen, a botanist by trade, and named it "Taste of Old St. Augustine." It became a division of their specialty-foods business.

Said Barbie, "Our mission is to foster awareness of our great, ancient city through the creation of wonderful-tasting products." Their datil-based products include two types of hot sauce, barbecue sauce, two marinades, a spice blend, and other seasonal products, which are made in small batches using locally raised ingredients.

Small yellow, and fiery hot datil peppers are deeply rooted in both St. Augustine culture and the culture of the local Minorcans, descendants of immigrants from the Spanish island of Minorca, who have been in St. Augustine since the 1700s. It's believed that the peppers most likely came from the Caribbean, but they grow only in Florida today. Datils, which are in the same family as super-spicy habaneros but with a sweeter flavor, are heavily used in Minorcan cooking.

From New Vision Community Church's *Feeding the Flock*, we have Nancy Payne's Butternut Squash Casserole. These large squashes are wonderfully delicious and nutritious, as well as satisfying to us as we consume them. They are also thrifty considering their benefits, and easily prepared as they are quickly baked in the oven.

Old-timers could make mouth-watering dishes for their family with

access only to scant ingredients. Maple Apples from *The Original Country Cookbook* has just three ingredients: apples, sugar, and water. Bake for an hour to an hour and a half. But since I do have cinnamon in my pantry, I just might be tempted to shake a little bit over the top before popping it into the oven. Yes, ma'am!

Joyce Lampp's Cranberry Salad is a winner! It is sweet, tangy, and crunchy. It is very, very good, and it goes well with all kinds of meat including ham, and turkey, or chicken.

Lillian Cleghorn's (delicious!) German Chocolate Pound Cake calls for a box cake and can of frosting. It's super easy, and the icing is in the cake! This comes from Northside Baptist Church's cookbook.

EMILY MEGGETT'S PORK LOIN ROAST

Recipe from Gullah Geechee Home Cooking by Emily Meggett
6 to 8 pounds pork loin roast

- Seasoning salt**
- Self-rising flour,**
- preferably White Lily**
- 1 large onion, sliced**
- 1/2 bell pepper, sliced**
- 1 (0.7-ounce) package dry Italian dressing mix**
- 1 teaspoon Kitchen Bouquet (optional)**

1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Rinse the pork loin and pat it dry with a paper towel. This will allow the seasoning to adhere. Sprinkle with seasoning salt to taste. Dust with flour. 2) Place the loin in a 10 by 14-inch roasting pan. Top with the onion and bell pepper. Sprinkle with the Italian dressing mix. Add 4 cups water and Kitchen Bouquet, if using, to the pan. Cover. 4) Bake for 2-1/2 hours. Add more water during the cooking time, if needed.

MINORCAN BLACK BEANS

Recipe from FIELD TO FEAST

- 1 pound dried black beans**
- 1 ham hock**
- 1/4 cup olive oil**
- 3 red or green bell peppers, diced**
- 3 cloves garlic, minced**
- 2 onions, diced**
- 1/4 pound Spanish chorizo sausage, sliced**
- 1/4 cup sherry vinegar or red-wine vinegar**

- 4 bay leaves**
- 1/2 fresh datil pepper, minced,**
- or 1 teaspoon datil hot sauce**
- Coarse salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste**
- Cooked white rice, for serving**
- Chopped raw onion, for garnish**
- Chopped fresh parsley, for garnish**
- Datil hot sauce, for garnish**

1) Soak beans in cold water to cover overnight. In the morning, drain beans and place in a large stockpot with ham hock and enough water to cover by 2 inches. Do not add salt (yet). 2) Simmer, partially covered, over low heat for 3 to 4 hours until beans are tender, adding water as necessary to keep beans submerged. 3) Meanwhile, heat oil in a large saute pan over medium heat. Add bell peppers, garlic, and onions and saute until softened, for 4 to 5 minutes. 4) When beans are tender, add cooked vegetables, chorizo, vinegar, bay leaves, and fresh datil or datil hot sauce. Add salt and pepper to taste. 5) Simmer, covered, for 1 hour to blend flavors. Add water, if necessary, so beans do not become too thick or dry. 6) Serve beans over cooked white rice and garnish with onion, parsley, and extra datil hot sauce on the side. This makes six servings.

NANCY PAYNE'S BUTTERNUT SQUASH CASSEROLE

Recipe from New Vision Community Church's *Feeding the Flock*

- 2 cups butternut squash, cooked and mashed**
- 3 eggs, beaten**
- 1/3 cup melted butter**
- 1/2 cup milk**
- 1 cup sugar**
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger**
- 1/2 teaspoon coconut flavoring**

Combine all ingredients, blending well; spoon into lightly greased 1-1/2 quart casserole dish. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour or until firm.

MAPLE APPLES

Recipe from *The Original Country Cookbook* Published by Paragon Products, Inc., Pompano Beach

- 8 tart apples**
 - 1 cup soft maple sugar**
 - 1-1/2 cups boiling water**
- Pare and core apples and place

in a shallow baking dish. Fill the center of the apples with soft maple sugar allowing 2 tablespoons of sugar for each apple. Put water in bottom of dish and bake in moderate 325-degree oven for 60-90 minutes until apples are soft, basting frequently with syrup made by the melting sugar and water. Serve warm with thin cream poured over the top.




